# AN HONORED CITIZEN DEAD

Col. T. B. Maddox Was Buried at Birdville Yesterday.

Col. T. B. Maddox, one of the old settlers of Tarrant county and a highly respected citizen, died Monday, very suddenly, and was buried at Birdville, yesterday. Many friends from Fort Worth attended the funeral.

Col. Maddox was in his seventy-seventh year. He came to Tarrant county about thirty-three years ago. He served as county commissioner for two terms in the '90s. He was an ardent promoter of the good roads movement throughout the county, and it was owing to his indefatigable efforts that a good start was made in that direction ten years ago.

After serving two terms as county commissioner he was chosen representative of Tarrant county and served in the legislature very acceptably during the Hogg administration.

Some time ago he was stricken with a cancer and came to Fort Worth to have it treated. He leaves a wife, one son, George Maddox and a daughter, Mrs. Russell, all living in the community where he has resided so long—about eight miles north of Fort Worth on the Keller road.

## ST. LOUIS CONDITIONS.

St. Louis, June 9.—President Gordon Knox of the National Stock Yards exchange, said today:

"We will continue to do business, but as we cannot ship or receive any stock for a few days, things will be quiet. The cattle pens are under water, and of course we cannot use them. The situation here is much worse than it was Monday, but it is back water, and I expect it to fall by night."

## LOCAL MARKET.

When the market opened for business yesterday but 24 cars were in the pens. Ten cars came in later, and even then the supply was hardly equal to the demand. Receipts yesterday were 1151 against half that number a week ago 2428, and 1374 for the corresponding Tuesday of May.

The sales were 1055 to packers and to others, leaving but 53 cattle and 222 calves unsold in the pens, probably the smallest number left over since the yards opened.

Few good bunches of steers were in the yards yesterday, and they went off quickly. The major portion of the run consisted of light stuff that was quickly sold at prices fairly steady. Tops of the day were a bunch of cake-fed grassers that averaged 11 and sold for \$4. Bulk of sales was around \$3.50.

Butcher stock moved freely, though prices that caused considerable grumbling on the part of salesmen. Cows were decidedly weak, but the closing of all Northern markets for Texas cattle by reason of the flood caused apprehension here that the market might be flooded with an over-run, and so sellers let go at the best prices they could get.

The top of the day was \$3.85, with the bulk of sales going around \$2.50.

Bulls, stags and oxen sold on a quiet market that approached weakness.

Calves rather dragged with a good supply on hand. Prices were not quite steady. Over 200 were left unsold.

## A BAR MEETING.

Yesterday morning in the Forty-eighth district court a meeting of the Fort Worth Bar association was held, over which Mr. George Thompson presided.

We realize that in the death of Mr. Branom, which occurred on June 4, 1903, the office of district clerk of Tarrant county has lost a faithful, upright and efficient deputy, and that the bar of Fort Worth has lost a public servant with whom it was a pleasure to come in daily contact. We especially desire to bear witness to his untiring patience in the discharge of his duties; to the fidelity and accuracy with which he performed his labors, and his uniform courtesy and politeness to members of the bar. He was a true type of the Southern gentleman, and we deeply deplore his loss, and trust that out of the mystery and gloom of death his spirit has found that "better land."

We recommend that these resolutions be spread upon the minutes of the district court as a lasting testimonial of the respect and esteem in which the deceased was held by the Fort Worth bar.

Mansfield Sun: It has never been the policy of the Sun to give every little lawsuit that comes up with rollicky youngsters or irate neighbors, but the suit adjudicated recently in which Mr. Williams was prosecuted for allowing his cattle to run at large was of such general interest that we report it.

Mr. Williams was convicted and had to pay a fine and costs amounting to \$21. Mr. Williams is one of the best men in that section, and but for the chesty talk of neighbors and friends as to what was or was not the law, and the vapourings of the lawyer about coming out from town and turning every one arrested loose, he would never have been put to that cost.

Jim Davis was the attorney for the defense, and laid his claim wholly along the line of the election being illegal. Illegal mainly because the votes were not counted within the ten days after the election as required by the statute. It will be remembered that Mr. Davis had an injunction from the district judge temporarily restraining the officers from so counting them.

In addressing the court Mr. Davis made the rather astonishing statement that he procured that temporary injunction for the purpose of putting this court off beyond the statutory limit, and not because he had any idea that the injunction would ever be made permanent, and that he only made it work because the courts didn't know any better.

In these days when some district judge can be found to enjoin nearly everything that a fellow don't like, at the ingenious plea of an attorney, it is rather discouraging to reflect that the attorney may go off afterward and ridicule the proceeding.
