Food Locker Group Picks New Officers

**W. P. Klein, Fort Worth,
Succeeds Beaumont Man
As State President**

Walter P. Klein of the Fort Worth Frosted Food Lockers was elected president of the Frozen Food Locker Association of Texas Friday in the second-day sessions of the organization's three-day annual convention at the Blackstone Hotel.

Klein, who has been the association's secretary, succeeded James Batterbee of Beaumont. Other officers elected were Douglas Anderson of Breckenridge, vice president, and Douglas Queureau of San Antonio, secretary.

During the afternoon sessions, Sid Warrington of Austin, formerly senior agricultural economist with the U. S. Agriculture Department in charge of economic research in locker plant operation, declared that during the past five years locker operators have been so busy that they have given little attention to factors influencing savings in operational costs and increases in revenue.

"That day is finished," Warrington advised, "and the operators must look forward to an era when competition from other food enterprises is going to be greater."

He warned the operators that they must learn to merchandise their services and must know how to emphasize their improvements.

Saturday morning's program will include a talk by Albert Todoroff of St. Louis, editor of "Locker Management," and a meat-cutting demonstration by J. W. Witte of Toledo, Ohio.

Restaurant Group Hears Talk On Handling Frozen Meats

Freezing units and cold storage facilities are among "the most important assets" of a restaurant business, Walter P. Klein, operator of the Fort Worth Frosted Food Lockers, told members of the Fort Worth Restaurant Association at a meeting at Hotel Texas Thursday afternoon.

Klein, who illustrated his talk with cuts of frozen meat, urged restaurant owners to exercise care in preparation and wrapping of meat to be sharp-frozen. He emphasized that metal foil and cellophane are superior to waxed paper as wrapping materials.

Guests included 25 directors of

the State Restaurant Association, who were in Fort Worth for a board meeting held Thursday morning at Colonial Cafeteria. Presiding at the conference was Carlton Lawler of Dallas, state president, with C. W. Horan, local president, as host.

The group heard Patrick D. Moreland of Austin, state executive vice president, report on the squeeze suffered by operators because of high food prices.

He will speak on the courthouse lawn here at 1:30 p. m. as the opening shot in what promises to be a vigorous campaign for the seat being vacated by Tom Connally.

Three more talks—at Waxahachie at 2 p. m., Cleburne at 4:30 and Weatherford at 8:30—will round out his first day of speeches.

Next week, he will speak in 24 cities in East and Central Texas.

For his opening here, the congressman will be accompanied by his twin sister, Mrs. Linnie Smith of Gladewater, and his father, O. J. Beckworth of Gladewater.

Also on the platform will be his wife, the former Eloise Carter of Ranger, and their four children.

Beckworth never has run in Kaufman County, but has received help from many residents of the area, which prior to 1932 was part of the congressional district he has represented for the last 14 years.

Beckworth is including Parker County in his opening day activities because of the many friends of his family in that section.

His uncle was the late J. P. Ransport of Weatherford. His father taught school at Diffau, in Erati County, and in Palo Pinto County. Another uncle, the late H. T. Beckworth, was school superintendent at Gordon, and the candidate's stepmother, Mrs. Pearl Phipps Beckworth, was a teacher in Comanche County.

Congressman Beckworth, at 38, has 18 years of legislative experience behind him. He served two terms in the Texas House before going to Washington.

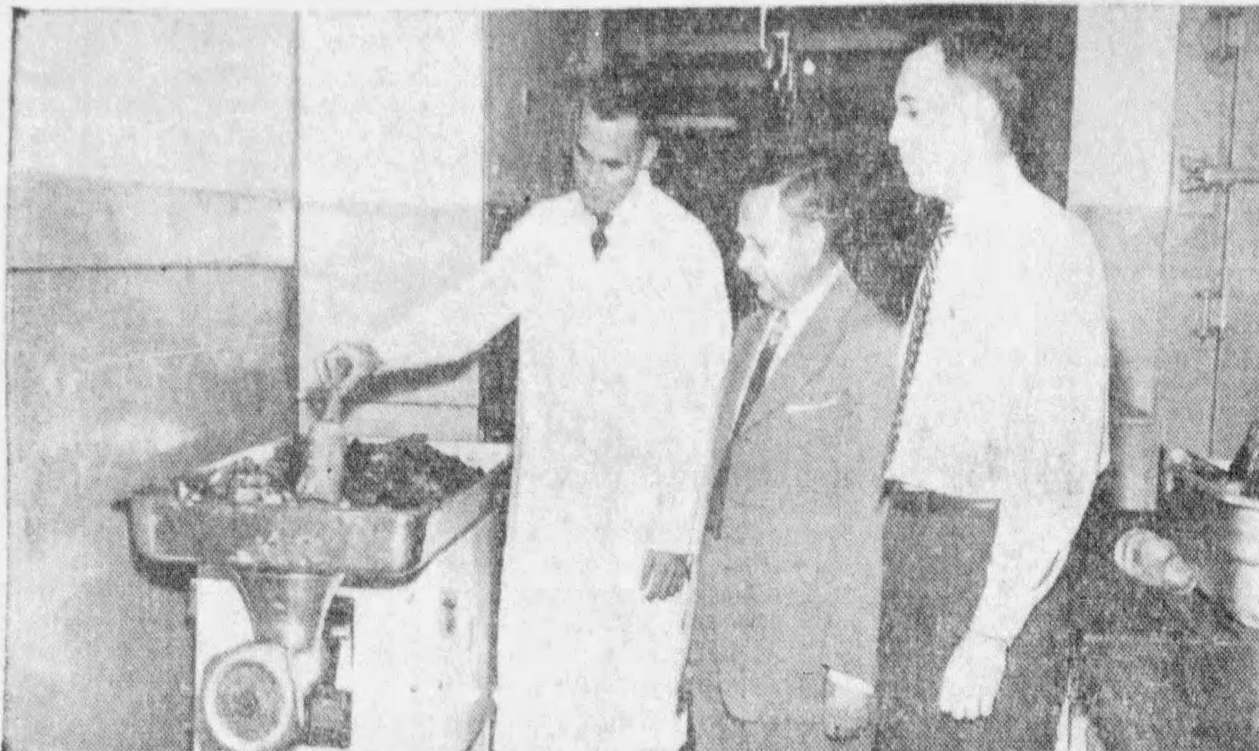
Berry Brothers and Donohue Cleaners bought the champion barrow of the junior show from Harold Lindley of Clarendon.

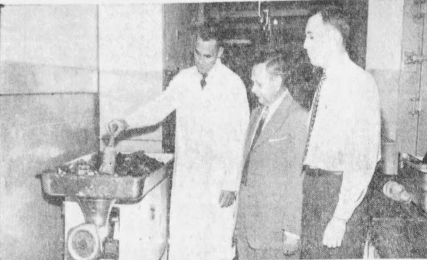

Largest Non-Atomic Blast Rips Peninsula in Utah

LITTLE VALLEY, Utah, July 21 (AP)—The biggest non-atomic explosion ever set off in the United States rocked this northern Utah peninsula in Great Salt Lake exactly as scheduled Sunday.

The blast sent up a cloud of dust and smoke exceeding projections. It was much more spectacular than engineers had forecast. Rocks showered onto nearby high tension lines and a transformer station and broke the lines, setting off a gaudy display of blue flames seen through the billowing clouds.

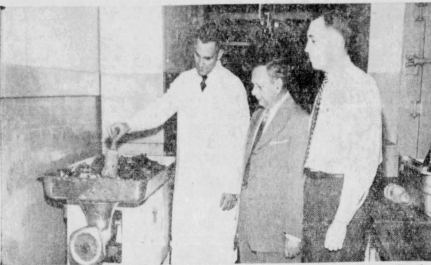

It obscured the mountain before drifting away to the north. The site was clear again within 10 minutes.

Approximately a dozen reporters and photographers and perhaps 100 construction workers, residents watched the blast from a sandpit about half a mile out in the lake.

FOR RAPID TURNOVER

Frozen Foods Inventoried

EVERMAN.—

A close inventory and a rapid turnover of food are features of the home freezer program used by Mrs. Ruda Johnson of Everman.

"Practically everything I freeze is used within the month," the Everman Home Demonstration Club member remarked.

Mrs. Johnson, who is a widow, keeps three or four elderly persons at her Pine Hill farm south of Everman.

"It is not a nursing home," she emphasized. "I keep three or four and think of it as sharing my home. I have no desire to make it commercial."

She said that she enjoyed the work and found it extremely satisfying. She began the practice seven years ago.

The home freezer is used extensively for advance meals.

"When I cook, I prepare several things for the freezer. I stay ahead with my meals and am ready for unexpected company," she explained.

One of her most widely used and favorite frozen foods is chicken pie. She said that the pie is popular with the elderly residents.

Pie Keeps Well

"The chicken pie is an excellent basic food for any type of menu," she remarked.

She usually makes three or four pies at one time and puts them in the freezer. They will keep indefinitely but are used within the month.

When the chicken pies are prepared, they are slightly under-baked. Mrs. Johnson believes this is the best way to handle them for freezing.

Two hens will make three pies. The hens are stewed until tender. The meat is skinned from the bone and chopped finely with a meat chopper.

Mrs. Johnson adds one bay leaf, one tablespoon of salt and one-fourth teaspoon of pepper. One-half cup of English peas and the same amount of diced carrots are added. She uses a rich pastry for the pie.

The pie is baked until slightly less than done and placed in the freezer.

A popular menu used with the pie includes Lyonnaise potatoes (which also are frozen), and giblet gravy. The giblets for the

gravy are frozen. The entire meal requires only 30 minutes from starting time until completely finished.

If the pie is to be used immediately, Mrs. Johnson recommends the use of sliced olives and pimientos.

She keeps records of frozen foods as they are put into the freezer. Meats, fish and other foods are placed according to the date of preparation.

"By taking the bottom package each time, we have no worry of leaving foods in until they are undesirable," she said.

Mrs. Johnson raises a big garden and freezes many of the

vegetables. Other products are canned.

She bakes pastries and stores them in the freezer for future meals.

"When I have time to bake, it is just as easy to make several things as one," she stated.

"The freezer offers the best utilization of time, energy and motion," said Mrs. Annie Mae Hatchett, Tarrant County home demonstration agent.

Mrs. Johnson is foods leader for the Everman Home Demonstration Club.

Founded Market

She was one of the founders of the Farm Homemaker's Market which operated across from the present site of Will Rogers Coliseum during the depression. Her specialty, she recalled, was Boston baked beans, brown bread and hominy.

Her first experience with canning food ended in distress.

"My first garden here (27 years ago) produced an extra large crop of spinach. I canned 64 pints and they all blew up in my face. A neighbor invited me to join a home demonstration club to learn more about canning," she laughed.

In 1933 she bought her first pressure cooker. It is still used sometimes during rush canning seasons.

"I find freezing much easier than canning and a tremendous labor saver," she said. She added that many foods are canned to suit the tastes of her elderly boarders.

Milk Average Up 4%

WASHINGTON, D. C. Reports to the U. S. Department of Agriculture crop reporting board said that milk cows produced an average of 23.23 pounds of milk per cow in early May. This was 4 per cent above last year's peak for the same period.

Production was at record levels in all regions. Total milk produced on farms was 11,171,000 pounds, slightly below last year's figure.

Hunters should deliver the hides to Leonards grocery store sidewalk loading zone on Throckmorton. The hides will be accepted any week-day during business hours and the driver of the car will not be bothered with a parking problem. Someone will be on duty on the sidewalk delivery station to take the hides.

Hunters should rub salt on the hides, or keep them in a cool place to prevent spoiling. The heads and feet can not be used by the hospital and therefore should be removed from the skins before delivery to Leonards or Fort Worth Frosted Foods.

Defrost and Clean Out

**Food Bargains Stretched
 By Proper Freezer Care**

The big rush for bargains at the fresh fruit, vegetable and produce markets will reach its peak during the ensuing summer months.

Included in this seasonal pilgrimage should be a side jaunt to the family food freezer with the words "defrost" and "clean-out" foremost in the minds of those who own that home convenience.

Food freezer authorities recognize the need for systematic defrosting of the home freezer for several reasons. These reasons especially hold true during the upcoming fresh fruits and vegetables season.

"When frost builds up in the freezer," explained Mrs. Lois McCulley, a home economist for Texas Electric Service Company, "you lose your seal. Consequently, you get a slower freeze on foods placed in the freezer, which means the enzyme action goes on longer." (Enzymes are what mature foods—the faster the freeze, the faster this action is stopped, leaving higher quality frozen foods).

INCREASES COSTS

Mrs. McCulley said that an over-abundance of frost in the freezer reduces capacity and can send the average estimated operational cost of 20 cents per cubic foot per month soaring upward.

Another TESCO home economist, Miss Anna Bines, home service director, advocated defrosting freezers at least twice a year.

"Sometimes," Miss Bines explained, "you can do an adequate job by just scraping the frost from the walls of the freezer." However, a complete thawing of the iced-over walls is a necessity some time during the year, she added.

A never-failing recognizable sign of need for defrosting is when the frost accumulation in the cabinet becomes so thick that it begins to interfere with the closing of the freezer's lid.

Defrosting may be done by one of two ways. You can unplug the freezer and let the ice thaw. Or, the freezer owner may employ the newer, speedier and cleaner method of using a heat lamp.

In the latter procedure, the rays of the lamp are directed on the sides of the freezer. The ice comes off in sheets, doing away with collection of the watery melted ice.

PREVENTS ODORS

After defrosting, the inside of the freezer should be wiped with soda and water dampened cloth. This removes spillage and prevents bad odors.

"Always be sure and check the temperature after defrosting and make sure it's maintaining 0 degrees," Mrs. McCulley emphasized. She said it was wise to keep a thermometer in the unit at all times, so systematic temperature checks can be made.

With some of the newer freezers, defrosting is a thing of the past as they are built fool-proof against the accumulation of frost. But, owners of these new models should follow other rules in operating their freezer.

Perhaps the most important of these rules, as advocated by TESCO freezer authorities, is the proper packaging of foods prior to their deposit in the unit.

"Moisture and vapor proof packages are a necessity if the

homeowner intends to maintain the quality of frozen foods," stated Mrs. McCulley.

"Good quality meats, fruits and vegetables placed in a freezer poorly packaged, will come out a bad product including loss of flavor and freezer burn," added Mrs. Nadine Moyers, TESCO home service adviser.

Mrs. Moyers asserted that there are many new materials on the market that make packaging an easy and thorough job.

STICK TO QUALITY

Freezer owners should remember when freezing foods, that they only get the quality of foods out of the freezer that you put into it. Consequently, high quality foods are endorsed the highest for freezing.

Along the packaging line, it should be remembered that all foods should be properly marked, showing the time placed in the freezer. Recommended storage period for frozen ground meat, ham, and bacon is 1 to 3 months; pork, fish and lamb 3 to 6 months; beef, veal and poultry 9-12 months; and fruits and vegetables 12 months. Pre-cooked foods may be stored successfully up to six months.

Another thing recommended by TESCO home economists is to plan meals around the freezer. For instance, if you are going to cook foods from the freezer for two meals in one day, try to get all the necessary foods in one trip.

Reason for this is that cold air escapes when the freezer door is opened. This makes the unit's motor run longer to keep the temperature down. That sends the operating cost up.

These and many other helpful hints on the proper care and maintenance of freezers are available at many utilities companies throughout the state.

Food freezers have many ad-

vantages. Home owners have found their freezers occupy an important nook in their cooking area. The value of this home convenience has been proven thoroughly. A dish of fresh strawberries or peaches set before the family in the middle of winter brings a hearty gleam of approval.

The family may not realize it, but the housewife knows it was because of the freezer and its proper care and utilization.

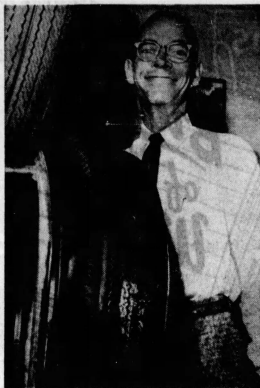
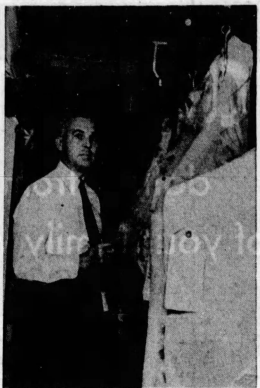
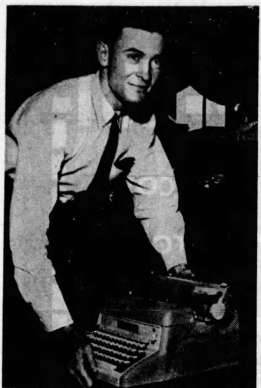
Even in this age of space, the mention of a mechanical cow will probably furrow the brows in scorn.

But, Paul O'Brien and Bobby Martin, Collin County farmers, own two of the "mechanical bovines" and they're raising calves past the weaning stage with the ingenious inventions.

The devices are called "nursettes" and are capable of handling 15 calves that are bawling for milk. They provide milk on a round-the-clock basis and anytime the calf outscraps his companions for the machine's long nipple, it eats.

The nursette prepares a 10-ounce serving of milk every four minutes, using powdered milk and warm water. When one service is consumed, the mixing cycle begins again.

With the device, calves may be taken from their mothers after one or two feedings, allowing the mothers to return to normal production within a few days.

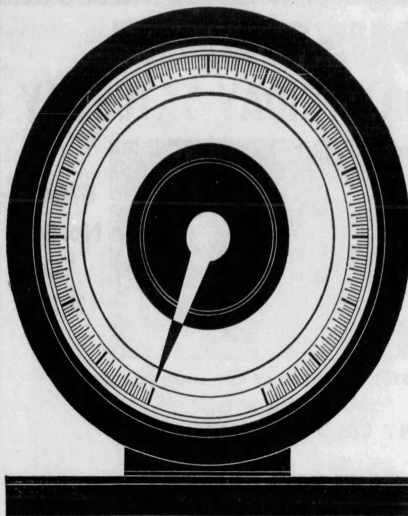

Negro Wants to Take His Family to Russia, Even Cuba

NEWARK, N. J., April 11 (AP)—William Clark, a Negro who sent his daughter to school in the Soviet Union, wants to leave the United States with his family and has written to President Kennedy to explain his case.

"I want to get out of this country," Clark said Wednesday. "I'd prefer to take my family to Russia, but we'll even go to Cuba if necessary."

Clark, father of six, seeks a U. S. passport but claims the State of Georgia will not give him a necessary certificate of birth. He seeks help from the President, "whom I respect and revere."

Clark's daughter, Huldah, 15, has attended a Moscow school since last September, with all travel and living expenses paid by the Soviet government. She and her father have claimed Russia offers better educational fa-

ilities than would be available to a Negro in this country.

"We are not running from Jim Crow," Clark told the President.

"We are being forced out." He cited "pressures" brought against him and his relatives since his daughter left for Russia.

He had harassment included threats of court action by his landlord for nonpayment of rent a step "rarely if ever taken against other tenants," together with charges of Communist Party membership and even threats to his life.

Clark claimed his father, Jessie, 68, who lives in Brinson, Ga., had been evicted from his home and denied his Social Security rights as a result of Huldah's departure for Russia. An uncle residing in Newark also has suffered harassment, Clark claimed.

Clark said he had not yet applied to the Soviet embassy or to the Cuban government for a visa. He intended to see FBI authorities Wednesday "to talk some sense with men who represent the President."

In his letter, Clark asserted he was willing to give up his U. S. citizenship.

In addition to Huldah, the Clarks have four sons and a daughter, ranging in age from 3 to 13.

Economic Woes Face Argentina

BUENOS AIRES, April 11 (AP)—Labor, political and economic storm clouds gathered darkly over Argentina Wednesday. Argentines faced sharp price rises under drastic tax and monetary decrees of President Jose Maria Guido's young government.

There was a hint that railway fares will be increased, piling further rises on top of four measures that economists estimated will boost the cost of living at least 10 per cent. Importers and business men were hit hard.

Labor leaders considered a nationwide general strike. The political front, Guido called congress from his recess to meet Thursday for consideration of a bill that in effect would extend his lease on the presidency.

Under the present law, Guido—the military approved successor to ousted President Arturo Frondizi—would be obliged within 30 days to call a presidential election to be held 30 days later. The administration wants congress to extend the term for calling an election to 180 days, without fixing a date for the vote.

Until new members take their seats May 1, it will still be dominated by Frondizi's Intravagant Radicals, who have been pressing for his release and reinstatement ever since his arrest March 25.

So you killed a duck, or a goose, or a deer.

Now what are you going to do with it? A surprising number of hunters, says Walter Klein at Fort Worth Frosted Food Locker, bring their deer in, have them cut into roasts, steaks and chops and then instruct him to give them away.

"I don't like venison," they say.

Some are more honest.

"My wife just doesn't know how to cook it," they admit.

Let us not kid each other.

Wild game does have a "gamey" flavor. Not all the apples, oranges, celery and other things stuffed into the geese, ducks and venison roasters is going to remove all the wild game taste and odor from beast or fowl.

They help, but he who doesn't like the taste of venison, duck or goose still isn't

going to like it even if its served like pheasant under glass.

However, if more people had the proper recipe, and knew how to prepare the game for the cook in the first place, there might be more outdoors-type gourmets. I might even become one of them.

QUICK DRESSING OF GAME GREAT FLAVOR AID

With the deer, goose and wild turkey seasons in progress, and the duck season opening at sunrise next Wednesday, Paula Jones, home economist with Texas Electric Service Company, offers a recipe for roast duck with mandarin orange-bread stuffing.

First, a tip to the hunter. The sooner the game's innards are removed the better. In the case of deer, you can't get that skin off of 'em quickly enough, either. The hide does as much to ruin the flavor of venison as anything.

The duck recipe:

| 2 (4 pounds) ready-to-cook ducks | $\frac{3}{4}$ teaspoon salt |
| $2\frac{1}{2}$ quarts soft bread crumbs | $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon celery salt |
| 1 cup or 1 (11-ounce) can mandarin orange sections | 3 tablespoons melted butter or margarine |
| $\frac{1}{2}$ cup orange juice | |

Rinse ducks in cold water and pat dry. Combine soft bread crumbs, orange sections and juice, salt, celery salt and melted butter. Fill neck and cavity of ducks lightly with stuffing. Truss the ducks. Prick the skin with a sharp fork to permit fat to run out during roasting. Roast according to your favorite method. Yield: 8 servings.

Of all the waterfowl a hunter can bring home, the wild goose has the best chance to become a table delicacy.

WILD GOOSE CAN BE EAGER EATERS' FAVORITE

Here is Miss Jones' formula for roast goose with fruit-bread stuffing:

| 3 quarts soft bread crumbs | $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar |
| 3 cups diced, peeled apples | $\frac{3}{4}$ cup melted bacon drippings |
| $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups seedless raisins, washed | 9-pound ready-to-cook goose |
| $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups orange juice | |

Combine soft bread crumbs, apples, raisins, orange juice, sugar and bacon drippings. Rinse goose in cold water and pat dry. Spoon stuffing into neck cavity, using enough to fill the skin so goose will look plump when served. Fold neck skin over and skewer it to back. Put the remaining stuffing into the body. When body is filled, close the cavity to hold the stuffing in (either sew the skin together with heavy string or skewer it together and lace with heavy string). Skewer wings to body until they rest flat against the neck skin. Cross legs, tie securely with heavy string and fasten to tail. Place goose on rack in shallow pan. Insert a meat thermometer through the membrane between the first and second ribs, so that end reaches into center of stuffing. Roast uncovered in a slow oven (325 degrees F.) until thermometer reaches 165 degrees F. and meat is tender. Yield: 9 cups stuffing and 9-pound roast goose.

And here is Miss Jones' suggestion for venison cutlets:

Clean and trim slices of venison cut from loin. Sprinkle with salt and pepper, brush over with melted butter or olive oil, and roll in soft stale bread crumbs. Place in broiler and broil 5 minutes or saute in butter. Serve with currant jelly sauce seasoned with port or Madeira. Allow 1 cutlet or more per person.

WHAT'S NEW FOR THE HOME

Wood Slat Awnings Strong, Diffuse Light, Break Up Heat

BY FRANCES TROY SCHWAB. Slat awnings, principal advantages of which are year-around usefulness and a construction which admits the passage of light and air but not heat, have been obtainable in metal for some time. Now a wood version of this ventilated type of permanent installation awning has appeared. It is good looking and thoroughly practical for any kind of house. The awnings are made of redwood, will withstand all kinds of weather and will last, according to the manufacturers, as long as the house they are on. They are built in two staggered layers of slats, an arrangement which diffuses light and breaks up the heat of the sun, also gives the awning extra strength and stability. The overlapping layers of slats deflect rain, too, and since each slat is grooved, the rain runs down and off the ends. Thus the awnings can function as an effective protection over a doorway or porch. Hot air, of course, escapes out through the slats instead of forming in heavy pockets underneath. This does away with the chief discomfort associated with ordinary awnings and the close and oppressiveness that stored air produces. Installation involves screwing the awnings firmly to the building, eliminating rattles and flaps. They can be uncrewed easily and removed for the winter if desired. The redwood is cured, stained and stamped envelope with an especially prepared prime coat first, then covered with an outside enamel paint. There's a new plastic toilet seat on the market which seems to be a very good buy. It is all plastic, even the burners. It is very light to handle, but strong. In testing its strength, the manufacturers ran a three-ton truck over it without cracking or deforming it. It has no paint or finish to crack or peel off. It comes in white, black, blue, green and rose at department stores and large plumbing supply dealers. I've been trying out several models of labor-saving floor wax dispensers for the household. Some distribute the wax through the shaft of the dispenser by means of a lever, some have a dispensing can attached to the side of the shaft, also operated by a lever. The latter save time, but back bending and wax distribute the wax more evenly as well as more economically. WHY GROW OLD? by Josephine Lowman

Two health and beauty habits which most women neglect are deep breathing and drinking enough water. Unless the weather is hot and we are actually thirsty we are very likely to imbibe much less water than is best for us. When we breathe deeply the heart is purified, the circulation aided and the complexion is improved. Every human should try to avoid the habit of shallow, upper chest breathing, so that his unconscious intakes are deep diaphragmatic affairs. Beside improving your unconscious breathing habits, regular breathing exercises will be beneficial. This is one: Lie on your back on the floor. Bend both knees and place your feet flat on the floor. Begin breathing at your diaphragm. You will feel your ribs spreading sideways. Do not lift your chest. When you exhale pull your abdominal muscles in and up but do not let your ribs collapse. Practice this, carefully trying to get the feeling of deep breathing, correctly done. As you breathe in, your diaphragm and abdominal wall moves up. As you exhale, the abdominal wall and diaphragm return to normal position. After practicing the first exercise for some time try this one: Same starting position as the one
