### OBITUARIES AND DEATH NOTICES FROM THE TEXAS BAPTIST HERALD

Abstracted by Mildred Bagley Smith (Continued from Volume 14, Number 4)

The names of contributors to the <u>Texas Baptist Herald</u>, for the years 1865 through, it appears, 1869, have been catalogued at Fleming Library. The names of the principal subjects have also been catalogued, thus providing a cross reference. In some instances, when only an initial was given, the contributor has been identified.

This file has been checked, and an attempt made to locate every death notice, no matter how obscure. Many of these notices are difficult to find in that they appear in news items, letters to the editor, sometimes rather casually in the editorial columns, and in <u>Notes by The Way</u>. The latter is variously entitled<u>Way Notes</u>, and other similar titles, and is, in reality, notes made by ministers and others while on trips, having to do with their observations of the country through which they travelled, the people they saw, and the churches they attended while on their way from place to place.

Beginning in this issue, at the conclusion of microfilm roll No. 3270.1, some obituaries overlooked earlier, and death notices which have been located with the help of the card index, will be published. Others will follow at a later date, and as located. The problem: the compilers of this index have made many errors. In many instances the reference is to column 1, and the data is actually found in column 7. Since some of the references cannot be found, it is possible that, in some cases, the page number is incorrect. (The pages are not numbered.) When it is not possible to readily find the reference, the data from the file card will be published.

The following abstracts are from microfilm roll 3270.1, The Texas Baptist Herald, 1865-1870, Serials Division, Fleming Library, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Texas. In parenthesis, following the abstract, will be found the date of the newspaper, followed by the page and column.

Mrs. MARY T. HARRISON, wife of Dr. RICHARD HARRISON, of McLennan County, Texas, died of black jaundice on 24 October 1869 after an illness of nine days. She was born in Morgan County, Georgia, September 19, 1837; united with the Baptist church at age 15; and was married February 24, 1857 to Dr. RICHARD HARRISON, then of Monroe County, Mississippi. Mentioned: children, husband, mother. Signed, H. M. H. (Nov 10, 1869; 3.2)

DENNETT HOUSTON, son of ISAAC T and LUCY A. HOUSTON, died at his home in Grimes County December 6, in the 13th year of his age. Sisters mentioned. Signed, T. O. Y. Weberville, December 11, 1869. Resolution of Colorado Lodge No. 87, of Free and Accepted Masons, upon the death of BENJAMIN WALKER. Signed, Dr. L. D. HILL, W. M. P. HARRIS. (Jan 12, 1870; 3.2)

DORAS LOTT, daughter of JESSE and LOUIS (sic) LOTT, was born 22 July 1816 in Mobile, Alabama; was married to MOSES SUMRALL 3 April 1834; joined the Baptist church July 1836. She died in Liberty County, Texas 19 October 1869, leaving a husband and eleven children. Signed, E. (Jan 12, 1870; 3.2)

Mrs. SUE BELL, daughter of brother JOSIAH and sister LEAKE, died at the residence of the Rev. J. LEAKE on January 16, in the 30th year of her age. She joined the Baptist church at age 12; was married to R. L. BELL in August 1869, "by the writer." During the sad occurrence, her parents were far away in Kentucky. The Baptist and Western Recorder will please copy.

Mrs. MARY A. BELL, wife of Capt. Wm. A. Bell, died in the vicinity of Bryan 18 January 1870 in the 49th year of her age. "She leaves a deeply afflicted family, husband, children (adopted) and relatives, with a wide circle of friends to mourn their loss." She joined the Baptist Church of Christ at Shady Grove, Union County, Arkansas, nearly 25 years ago. "Having never been blessed with children of her own, she, with her devoted Christian husband, has raised and educated, in whole or in part, it is said, <u>twenty-seven</u> orphan children." She was a native of Conechu (Conecuh) County, Alabama. Louisiana Baptist, please copy. Signed, F. M. L. (Mar 9, 1870; 3.2)

Mrs. BETTIE JARMON, wife of C. C. JARMON, and daughter of W. R. and E. POLLARD, departed this life 22 February 1870, at the age of about 30. She joined the Baptist church in 1863. "She left a darling little babe about 3 months old." Signed, A Friend. (Mar 16, 1870; 3.2)

SUSAN SANDERS, wife of Wm. N. SANDERS, died in Grimes County, Texas 24 March 1870. She was born in Leon County, Florida 2 March 1833, the daughter of S. and ELIZABETH DAVIS, and emigrated to Texas in 1860. In 1864 she united with the Baptist church. Signed, J. H. S., Anderson, Texas. (Apr 13, 1870)

JOHN HAWKINS LAUDERDALE was born in Sumner County, Tennessee, 29 September 1817. His father moved to Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, in 1818, and thence to Lownds County, Mississippi in 1825, where Bro.L. lived until he emigrated to this state. Bro. L. joined the Baptist church at Oak Ridge, and was baptized by Elder J. NASH in 1836; was married to his first wife in 1848, by whom he had two children. Both are dead. He emigrated to this state and county in 1850. The year following he joined the Baptist church at Gay Hill, and was soon chosen a deacon of the church. In 1854 he married a second time, an amiable and pious sister, by whom he had six children, three of them dead. He died 28 March 1870, aged 52 years and 6 months. (June 15, 1870; 3.5)

NOTE: This obituary was not signed, and the names of his wives were not stated. An obituary, signed E. J. L. Gay Hill (Texas), appeared in the issue of Sept. 15, 1869, in which it is stated that LILLIE A. LAUDERDALE, the deceased, was the daughter of Capt. JOHN H. and LIZZIE LAUDERDALE. See Footprints, Vol. 14, Number 4. MBS.

Dr. W. P. SMITH was born in Washington County, Alabama, 6 April 1833, and was the oldest son of his parents, bro. WILLIAM and sister MARY SMITH. He was graduated from the New Orleans School of Medicine in the spring of 1858. Thence he came to Shelby County, Texas, where he practiced his profession, escept for time served in the Civil War, until his death. He died far from home and loved ones. He was a member of the church, and of the Executive Board of the Mt. Bethel Association, member Newborn Lodge No. 97 (?) of A. M. and F. M. Masons over which lodge he long presided as W. M. Mentioned: wife, little children, aged parents, brother and sisters. He died in New Orleans in February 1870 of lockjaw, which was preceded by a surgical operation to which he had submitted. "Then farewell, WILLIAM, for awhile...." Signed, J. C. MOTT, (June 22, 1870; 3.4,5)

WILLIAM KIEKHAN, aged 40 years, died on the 19th of June 1870, on Willow Creek, Harris County, Texas. He left a bereaved widow. Signed, L. Doughtie. (June 29, 1870; 3.5)

Mrs. MARY E. BURRELL, wife of JAMES T. C. BURRELL, died in this city on June 27th, aged 21 years. She was baptized by Bro. CHANDLER some years ago and became a member of Shiloh Church, Fayette County. Having removed to this city, she was received into the fellowship of the Houston church in June 1868. "In a few hours after her death, her little one followed her to the 'house appointed for al living'." Signed, S. E. B. (July 6, 1870; 3.4)

NANNIE E. MASON, daughter of Elder W. A. MASON, died at Towash, Hill County, Texas on 24 May 1870, in the 13th year of her age. "Taken sick during the temporary absence of her parents, she was laid upon a bed of suffering at the house of a neighbor... Her father, who is a Missionary Agent for the Baptist State Convention of Texas, protracted his absence beyond her death about two weeks, being, of course, in ignorance of the sad sad news that awaited him.... A stepmother, who was as a devoted mother, three brothers and a vast crowd of friends...had mournfully followed her to the 'house appointed for all living'." Signed, S. E. B. (July 6, 1870; 3.4)

Mrs. ROSSIE L. McJUNKIN died in Huntsville, Texas on the 1st inst., aged 24 years and 8 months. "She was a native of the State of Georgia, from which she emigrated with her husband to Texas in 1866. She professed conversion in the summer of 1863, and was baptized a few momths afterward by Elder M. B. L. BINION. On the third of May 1864 she was married to the author of this notice, unto whom she was an affectionate and devoted companion until her death. Though young, she had many trials, some of them peculiar to the wife of a minister.... No one knew her worth so well as her husband. His loss is irreparable. How much greater the loss of her two little children? Signed, S. B. McJUNKIN. (July 13,1870;3.4.)

"Mrs. SALLIE D. McDONALD (formerly Mrs. PREWETT) died at Waco on the 2nd day of June 1870 in the sixtieth year of her age, having been born on the 17th day of October 1810. Her death breaks another link of the chain which binds our thoughts to the 'olden time'.... Her devotion as a mother to an only daughter was surprisingly beautiful. The death of that daughter (Mrs. JOSEPHINE SPEIGHT, wife of Gen. J. W. SPEIGHT) in July 1867, was a crushing blow to the heart and hopes of her mother." Mother and daughter now rest side by side. Signed, W. (July 13,1870; 3.4) NOTE: The deceased was formerly married to MARK PREWETT. See obituary of MRS. JOSEPHINE SPEIGHT, Footprints, May, 1971. MBS

Mrs. ELIZABETH WILLIAMS was born in Edgecomb(e) County, North Carolina 13 May 1808. She joined the Methodist Episcopal church about the year 1829; emigrated first to Alabama, then to Texas, where she, as a member of the Methodist Episcopal church, lived about 10 years. She then moved to Robertson County, Texas, where she died 21 June 1870, aged 62 years, 1 month and 8 days. "Mrs. WILLIAMS was the head of a well raised family of 9 children, sons and daughters. Two of them are gone before.... One of her sons is now a Baptist minister." Survived by husband and children (names not given). "Her remains rest in the cemetery in Owensville, Robertson County, Texas." Signed, H. R. MUHLEACH, Port Sullivan, Milam County, Texas, June 29, 1870. (July 20, 1870; 3.5)

DANIEL A., infant son of L. A. and Mrs. SALLIE TURNER, died at the residence of J. W. DAVIS, Houston, July 13, 1870, aged 5 months and 3 days. Hazelhurst, Mississippi, papers please copy. (July 27, 1870; 3.5)

WILLIE L., only son of ROBERT N. and TENN. H. PIPKIN, aged 17 months and 27 days, came to his untimely death 26th July, 1870 - "the horses his father was driving taking fright and running away with the vehicle, one of the wheels striking and crushing his head...." Signed, J. S. (Aug 3, 1870; 3.4)

Mrs. SARAH ELIZABETH, wife od Dr. J. E. JOHNSON, and daughter of Mr. ISAAC PARKS, died near Anderson, Texas, at the residence of Mr. JOSEPH WHITE August 1, 1870, in the thirty-first year of her age. She united with the Baptist church in September 1855. Signed, J. H. S. (Aug 10, 1870)

Elder HENRY DAVIS died very suddenly at his residence near Farmington, Texas, 23 March 1870, aged 73 years, 4 months and 4 days. "He was born and reared in Virginia, lived some years in Illinois, and moved to Texas in 1856. He professed religion about the year 1835, and was ordained to the ministry in 1840...." Signed, T. B. McComb. (Aug 24, 1870; 3.5)

Mr. JOSEPH A. SHEPHERD, son of B. A. and MARY SHEPPERD, died in this city on the 23d August last, in the 28th year of his age. "His life was full of sadness and sorrow. It was his misfortune to bury two wives and an infant in the course of a few years." He was converted and baptized in Virginia. Mentioned: service in Civil War. Signed, Pastor. (Sept 21, 1870; 3.3)

Mrs. JULIA F. CYCLE was born in Williamson County, Tennessee, on the 15th of November 1823, and died in the city of Galveston, July 8th, 1870. She married R. G. RYLE April 16th 1840 and professed religion in 1842." Mentioned: husband, children, and one sister who is deceased. Signed, A Friend. (Oct 5, 1870; 3.3)

Mrs. LUCY ELIZA WISE, wife of J. L. WISE, died at the residence of her husband near Plantersville, Grimes C ounty, Texas, 28 September 1870. She was born in Claiborne County, Mississippi, 12 January 1820, daughter of JOHN E. and JANE HALL, and was married 2 July 18\_5 (faded). She united with the Baptist church at Utica, Mississippi in 1842. She was a kind mother, affectionate and devoted wife. Signed, T. W. BLAKE, Plantersville, October 8, 1870. (Oct 19, 1870; 3.3) PHEBE N. FINCH died at Milford, Ellis County, Texas, 21 August 1870, in the 48th year of her age. She was a native of Pike, Wyoming County, New York, and had been a member of the Baptist church since the 11th year of her age. She leaves a husband and 2 children. (Oct 5, 1870; 3.3)

Miss JOSEPHINE McGUFFIN died in the town of Montgomery 11 September 1870, in the 27th year of her age. She united with the church in Montgomery in 1861. "...sympathize with her loved father, brothers and sisters...." (Oct 26, 1870; 3.3)

Mrs. MARY B. ATKINSON, wife of Col. J. ATKINSON, died at the residence of her husband, near Chappell Hill, Washington County, Texas, 14 October 1870. She was born in Pickens County, Alabama, 23 September 18\_2(1822?faded), and moved in December of the same year to Noxubee County, Mississippi. She soon afterwards was baptized into the fellowship of the church at Mushulaville, by Elder Wm. LLOYD. She removed to this county in the spring of 1852 and united with the Providence Church. Signed, M., Chappell Hill, Texas, Oct. 22, 1870. Galveston <u>News</u> and <u>Baptist</u> of Memphis, Tennessee, are requested to copy. (Nov 2, 1870; 3.3)

The Rev. JAS. HAYNIE (minister of the Baptist church) died at the residence of Dr. A. B. DODD in Jackson County, 4 November 1870, in the 75th year of his age. He was a native of Virginia and came to this country about 18 years ago. "His family consisted of an affectionate pious wife and two grown sons - (twins) one of them (the Joseph of their affections) fell a victim to the yellow fever at Lavaca, where he was a practicing physician - the first season of their arrival. This so p\_eyed (faded) on the heart of his mother that in a few short months the aged husband was bereaved of his wife also. In our late unhappy war, the last son (a minister of the church of his father), fell in the service of his country...." Signed, L. B. DODD. (Nov 23, 1870; 3.3)

B. F. THORNTON died at his residence in Hopkins County, Texas, 21 October 1870, in the 30th year of his age. He united with the Baptist church in his eighteenth year, in Pickens County, Alabama "(where he was born)." He leaves a wife and three small children. Signed, S. H. B., Pastor. (Dec 14, 1870; 3.3)

SILAS A FINCH, son of EDWIN and PHEBE FINCH, died in Galveston, March 11, 1866, age 12 years and two months. "Ten days after, his little sister ELSIE was also called away, aged 8 years." (May 30, 1866; 2.3)

LIZZIE P. STERLING, infant daughter of J. M. and M. E. STERLING, died May 18, 1866, age 1 year and 8 months. Signed, M. J. I. (June 13, 1866; 3.5)

Wm. HOWARD, a Baptist minister, in his <u>Notes By The Way</u> (notes made while on a trip away from home) writes that at Brenham he received word "of the death of my baby boy. .... We <u>still are seven</u>. God sustain the mother in the absence of the father." Caldwell, Burleson County, Aug. 20. (Sept, 1866; 2.5)

Letter from WILLIAM CAREY CRANE (of Baylor University) in tribute to his father, WILLIAM CRANE, who died in Baltimore 28 September 1866, at age 77. He was president of the Executive Board of the Maryland Baptist Union Association. (Oct 24, 1866; 2.6)

Footprints

Mrs. EL<u>MIR</u> TOLES, wife of GEORGE TOLES, died 12 September 1866, aged 22 years, 9 months and 23 days. She was the daughter of Dr. P. W. and ELIZA WINTER. The writer states that he has known her since early child-hood. Signed, A Sincere Friend, C. W. B. (Oct 24, 1866; 2.6)

Bro. McJUNKIN learned, upon his arrival in Navasota, that his mother had been buried a few hours before, and that the family were nearly all ill. -J. B. LINK, in editorial column. (Jan 2, 1867; 2.4)

P. M. L (AW) writes of the death, in Wytheville, Virginia, of the 27 year old son of S. S. and ANNA BAXTER, and grandson of the Rev. S. A. BAXTET. NOTE: The name of the deceased is not given. He had lived for awhile in Texas, returning to his father's home in August. An obituary was published in his native town, from which the writer obtained these facts, including a record of his service in the War Between the States. MB. (Jan 16; page 2)

Letter from Wm. CAREY CRANE, Independence, Texas, January 23, 1867, in which he writes of the death of his brother, A. JUDSON CRANE, of Richmond, Virginia. He mentions that in less than one year he has lost this brother, his father, and a sister. "A. JUDSON CRANE was twenty-two months my junior. In early life many thought us twins. We belonged, at first, to the same classes. We went together to boarding school in King Columbia College, and at Hamilton, N. Y. My brother gave himself to the bar; I consecrated myself to the pulpit. From 1839, to January 3d, 1867, he was a member of the Bar of Richmond. He contributed to the literary and political journals of Virginia, and at the time of the death of JOHN HAMPDEN PLEASANTS, was his associate in the editorial care of the Richmond Republican. We were baptized on the same day, in James River, by Rev. JAMES B. TAYLOR, D. D. But while my brother was a delegate to the Virginia Legislature, from the city of Richmond, in 1853, he accepted a challenge to a duel, and for that cause was excluded from the 2d Baptist church. He never affiliated with the Baptists afterwards, except as a trustee of Richmond College. About eighteen months before his death he was immersed by Dr. JOHN THOMAS, and gave in his adhesion to his peculiar views. The love of his kindred, his unselfish devotion to me, the noble impulses of his nature, his untimely death, all crowd upon my mind at this time.... In the political world he was well nown, and occupied a commanding position in political circles. He married as his first wife a grand niece of JOHN QUINCY ADAMS, and a great grand-daughter of JOHN ADAMS. He was the U. S. District Attorney for Eastern Virginia, one month, by appointment of Abraham Lincoln. His sirst wife lived and died a Baptist. His oldest son is now a member of Dr. FULLER'S church in Baltimore. His oldest daughter (Mrs. WOODS) and his mother-in-law are devoted and pious Episcopalians. He was know to the Baptist ministry generally.... His old friends, many of whom are in Texas, will be pleased to know that a volume containing a memoir, and his select addresses, lectures, speeches and practical effusions is to be published." (Jan 30, 1867; 2.6)

Tribute to the wife of Elder W. A. A. KEEN, who was buried "on the 11th of last October." Elder KEEN had been the pastor, church not named, for 24 years. Mentioned: husband, aged mother, children, brothers, and sisters. Signed, A Friend, Fall Branch, Tennessee, Dec. 1866. (Feb 6, 1867; 2.5,6)

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Note from Bro. (J.W.D.) CREATH, to the editor, dated February 19: "On my arrival home last evening, I found all the members of my dear family in bitter lamentation over the sudden death of our sweet daughter, Mrs. ANNA ELIZA ROBINSON, who left us for heaven on the 2d instant." Mentioned: devoted husband; four children. (Feb. 27, 1867; 2.3)

Mrs. DELILAH ROGERS, wife of ROBERT ROGERS, Sr., died at hear residence in Leon County, Texas, 29 January 1867. Signed, J. J. D. (Feb 27, 1867; 3.4)

"Bro. WILKINSON, of Kickapoo, sends us the very sad news of the death of Bro. DODSON, near Larissa, in Cherokee County - a brother beloved, noble and true. He says: 'Bro. E. DODSON died after an illness of nine days, at his residence in Cherokee County, on the 25th of February. He was an efficient member and deacon of the Baptist church at Boiling Spring, and being extensively known to the brethren of this, the Cherokee Association...." (Apr 3, 1867; 2.3)

Mrs. FREDONIA H. WHITLOCK, wife of ROBERT WHITLOCK, and daughter of W. D. and TURANA WHALEY, departed this life in Liberty County, Texas, April 7th, 1867 -- in the 25th year of her age. (May 15, 1867; 3.3)

Mrs. CAROLINE M. MORGAN, consort of KOS MORGAN, deceased, died in Steadmansville, Franklin County, Kentucky, April 16th, 1867, in the 48th year of her age. (May 15, 1867; 3.3)

Resolution to the memory of STEPHEN D. BRIGHT, member of Hopewell Church, Navaroo County, Texas, who died 18 June 1867. "...county deprived of an officer whose sense of justice, sound judgment...." Wife mentioned. Signed, H. R. PURYEAR, Moderator, P. H. MAYES, Clerk pro tem. Resolution adopted at a meeting held on Saturday before the Lord's day in July, 1867. (Aug 21, 1867; 2.7)

J. B. LINK, editor, writes, "From a private letter from Bro. Wm. HOWARD who is now at his home in Gainesville, Ala., we learn that there has been, and still is, a great deal of sickness there. His many friends in Texas will be pained to learn that he has had sad afflictions in his own family since his return to them some weeks ago. He has been sick himself, but is now better, and has lost two loved ones from his family circle; - one his darling little MINNIE, three years and 6 months old, the other an infant of less than three weeks." (Sept 4, 1867; 2.2)

Editorial concerning deaths reported in letters, states that <u>The Baptist</u> of November 2d gives a brief account of the life, history and last hours of Mrs. LOIS GRAVES, mother of the editor of that paper. She was 78 years of age. (Her son: the Rev. J. R. GRAVES) Nov 20, 1867; 2.2)

"Bro. W. W. DIAMOND and Col. J. J. DIAMOND, for some months past connected with the press of this city, and the principal conductors of the <u>Houston</u> <u>Journal</u>, have both died since our last issue. Twelve of their family circle have fallen victim to the prevailing fever. Their companions are left with the fragments, as it were, of their broken family." (Nov 20, 1867; 2.2) NOTE: The obituary of <u>Col</u>. W. W. DIAMOND was published in the same issue. See <u>Footprints</u>, Volume 14, No. 2, February, 1971, page 58 (24th page). LOUISA A. KIMBALL, daughter of the late Capt. W. W. DICKIE, of Walker County, and consort of the Rev. J. A. KIMBALL, died of yellow fever at home in the town of Montgomery, October 7, 1867. She was a native of Spartanburg District, South Carolina, and was about 30 years of age. Signed, F. M. LAW, Houston, Dec. 16, 1867. (Dec 18, 1867; 3.3) NOTE: See Footprints, Vol. 14, No. 2, page 53 (19th page), for obituary of Capt. W. W. DICKIE, and Vol. 14, No. 3, page 109, for letter from J. A. KIMBALL reporting the death of his wife, his niece and his wife's sister.

Mrs. MARY A. BOOTH, daughter of JOSEPH and MIMA (?) HICKS, was born near Salem, Tippah County, Mississippi, February 10, 1836. She united with the church with her parents in 1852, was married to JESSE BOOTH September 19, 1854, and died near Hockley, Texas, of yellow fever, October 26, 1867. (The writer quotes from a letter written by Mrs. BOOTH'S parents, to her husband and children, after her death.) Signed, J. B. L. (Dec 18, 1867; 3.3)

J. B. LINK reports that his father died 16 April 1868. He had nearly filled the measure of his three score years and ten. "Almost five years have past since the hand that tenderly guarded our childhood was placed in ours.... We have left to us a mother and three brothers." (April 29, 1868; 2.1)

Mr. T. M. BAGBY, of Houston, died 13 May 1868. (May 27, 1868; 2.1)

Resolution, by Sandy Creek Church, to the memory of Elder S. J. WRIGHT, who died at his residence in Fannin County, Texas, October 14, 1868. He was born in Butler County, Alabama, 9 September 1825, son of the Rev. ASA and ELIZABETH WRIGHT. His father emigrated to Texas and settled in San Augustine County about the year 1837. In 1841 Elder WRIGHT united with the Baptist church in Sabine county. He was married to Miss MARY CHERRY 12 November 1846; was licensed to preach in 1852; was regularly ordained in 1855. In 1857 he moved to Grayson County and settled at Kentucky Town, where he remained near two years, engaged in preaching and teaching school. He was called to the pastoral care of the Sandy Creek Church in 1858, and the Bonham church in 1861. About the close of the war he resigned as pastor of the Bonham church, but continued to serve Sandy Creek until his death. He leaves a wife, two children, an aged father, five brothers and two sisters. Done in Conference on Saturday before the 3d Saturday in November, 1868. Signed, JOHN CONNELLY, Moderator, GID. SMITH, Church Clerk. (Feb 17, 1869; 2.6)

SUSAN M. ARNOLD, consort of GEO. M. ARNOLD, died 10 March 1869. She was born in Henderson County, Tennessee, 20 April 1834, daughter of NOAH and ELIZABETH DOUGLAS. She was married to G. M. ARNOLD October 4, 1849, and moved to Texas in 1851. She and her husband presented their letters and were received into the Ebenezer church, Smith County, Texas, in 1852, in which church she was a member until her death. She leaves eight little children (one only 6 days old), her husband, and three sisters. (April 14, 1869; 2.7)

I feel sure that Elemna, of the obituary, was daughter of the above John, who was son of the above Zacharias, and that she was named for her aunt. H. W. Middleton, brother of John, was surely Holland W. Middleton, son of Zacharias. A descendant wrote me, in 1958, that Zacharias is buried in the Middleton graveyard in Panola County, Mississippi. The cemetery is located about 15 miles east of Batesville, Mississippi, in a pasture off the highway:

EDITORS' NOTE: Tarrant County lost virtually all of its records when the Courthouse burned on March 29, 1876. The earliest deeds recorded in Volume A are in reality being "re-recorded". No doubt much confusion existed at this time. This perhaps accounts for the fact that the earliest recorded deeds are not recorded in order, and some in fact, appear to be missing. The process of re-recording of deeds occured over a period of many years, some even in recent times. Not all of the destroyed deeds have been re-recorded in the Tarrant County records.

W. C. BOONE, Pastor (church not stated), writes from Bremon(d) June 19, 1871, to J. B. LINK, in which he tells of the baptism and death, within one weeks time, of WALTER H. ROBERTSON, step-son of R. P. SNELLING. A younger brother brought the news of his death. "We buried him by his mother's side.... He was born in Virginia, and was aged nineteen years and two days.... I have since baptized his only sister, and his brotherin-law is a seeker." (June 28, 1871; 2.4)

In 1835 he removed to Alabama, where he zealously preached the word for eleven years. Leaving Alabama in 1845, he went to Mississippi, where for fiteen years he faithfully broke the bread of life to the people. J. W. WEBB died August 14, 1871. He was "born in the state of Georgia, moved to Mississippi when quite a youth, married in Rankin County, in 1833, professed faith in Christ and united with the church at Steen's Creek; was clerk of this church for several years; removed to Harrison County, Texas, in 1844; united with Glade Springs Church, by which church he was set apart to the office of deacon. .... A devoted husband, an affectionate father, a dear brother and a good neighbor is gone." Mentioned: the bereaved wife, aged sister Webb; his children (nearly all of whom are members of the church). COLONEL THOMAS ANDERSON, of Port Sullivan, died in Houston on the 29th of August, 1871. TAYLOR was baptized by REV. DR. PARKINSON, and received into the fellowship of the First Baptist Church, of which the eloquent SPENCER H. CONE was subsequently the pastor. Soon after this event, the family removed to Virginia, and in Mecklenburg County, Mr. TAYLOR grew up to manhood, and commenced his ministry. After a few years of serving in this region as a missionary of the Virginia Baptist General Association, he became, in 1826, the pastor of the Second Baptist Church in Richmond. From that time to the present - a period of nearly a half-century - he has been a citizen of Richmond. (Jan 10, 1872; 2.7) NOTE: A long account of the life and work of the Rev. Taylor is given in this article, from which only a brief abastract was made. No other family names were included. MBS.

# BIBLIOPRINTS News from the Library

By the time you read this column, we will know whether a new central library building is in the immediate future. The major bonuses for genealogists, if the issue passes, are adequate parking and new equipment. This should appeal to those who read microfilm to any great extent.

Speaking of microfilm, this is your last chance to order film under the matching program for this year. We will close the matching program June 15. So, if there's census film or soundex you would like to have available, be sure to take advantage of this two-for-the-price-of-one opportunity.

Our thanks go to the Fort Worth Genealogical Society for making it possible for the library to have something to offer you at the North Carolina workshop. Because of budget cuts made by city hall, no funds are available for printing for the library this year, or for supplies to allow us to mimeograph. For this reason, we have not been able to do any booklets. The Society paid to have an updated version of our "They Came From the Old North State" and our basic booklet, "At the Foot of the Family Tree", printed. These will be available at the library for as long as they last, or by mail to those who send an 8 x 10 stamped, selfaddressed envelope.

Barbara Knox, that versatile lady, has shown another facet of her considerable talents. Along with being an author, genealogist, pillar of the census project, and able presider in the absence of our president, she is also a bibliographer. She helped greatly in the revision of the North Carolina bibliography, and is working on a list of Texas County Histories, which in its completeness and supplementary information, may be one of the most useful tools Texas genealogists have ever had.

We hear rumblings about a new animosity toward genealogists at the State Library and Archives and the Barker Texas History Center. We would greatly appreciate hearing from anyone who has had recent experiences in Austin so that we can get the straight of the situation and have full and accurate information to pass on to other patrons.

Those of you who read Willard Heiss in the Tri-State Trader may have seen his recent column on black genealogy. The article on which the column is based appeared March 9, 1972 in the <u>Wall Street Journal</u>. It dealt mainly with the experiences of Alex Haley, a black writer who spent seven years tracing his ancestry. Haley began his search with nothing more than a few traditional stories passed down through his family; by tracing the African words used in the stories he found the village where his 4th gr-grandfather was enslaved. The village storyteller told him the traditional tale of the eighteenth century slave raid; from this he was able to find the records of the ship which brought the man to Maryland in 1767. Mr. Haley has a book in the works which is an account of all of his ancestors, white and black (his paternal gr.-gr.-grandfather was Col. Thomas Jackson of Spotsylvania Co., Va.), and plans a how-to-book for blacks who want to trace their ancestry. He and his brother, a Washington attorney, are working on the organization of a library for black genealogy to be opened in Washington in 1976.

According to several authorities quoted in the article, American blacks are trying to find a source of strength in their heritage - a trend which beats burning down cities.

The most outstanding book received in recent months has been the American Society of Genealogists' <u>Genealogical Research</u>: <u>Volume II</u>. The first volume published by the A. S. G. (which is an organization made up of the cream of professional genealogists; at least those living on the east coast) has been long used as a text for courses in genealogy; the second is more of the same.

The states covered are primarily those created out of the old Northwest and Southwest territories, with the addition of Louisiana. Hopefully, a third volume will soon be forthcoming to cover the states west of the Mississippi. Texans will be especially interested in the articles on Alabama, Kentucky, Mississippi, and Tennessee. Other states represented are Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa, Louisiana, and the province of Ontario in Canada. Special articles include the migrations into the Northwest Territory, Huguenot migrations, and Jewis migrations.

The Tennessee article lists two books which we heartily recommend to everyone with Tennessee and Kentucky ancestry. These are from the circulating collection of the library, and may be taken home for study and pure reading pleasure. Harriette Simpson Arnow, after years of research, has recreated the life of those Tennessee and Kentucky pioneers who lived in the Cumberland River Valley which winds through eastern Kentucky and middle Tennessee. Her first book, Seedtime on the Cumberland, deals with the settlement of the area and the mechanics of pioneer life; her second, Flowering of the Cumberland, with the culture and society of the area during the years 1780-1803. You may find an ancestor, since she has drawn heavily on the records from which genealogy is made, and since the books are well-indexed, -but if not - you will still profit from a good understanding of how your ancestors worked and lived and how they moved West. The maps are especially good; her Explanation of Bibliographical References is almost a guide to research in Tennessee and Western North Carolina. The call number for both books is 976.85A. They may be obtained from the General Reference Department or by placing a reserve at your nearest branch library.

## A BANDONED CEMETERY ERATH COUNTY, TEXAS

This cemetery is about one mile across a pasture on what was once known as the "Old Finch" ranch, now known as the Cooper place. It is located 6 miles south of Gordon, Texas on the dirt road from highway 108 to the X-Ray Community. The cemetery is now surrounded by a barbed wire fence, but years of cattle grazing have taken its toll on the graves and markers. There are 18 very large rock vaults that have been completely destroyed. All the markers are lying flat on the ground.

The cemetery is about 400 yards down the REA right of way and is not fenced. It appears to have covered about 100 square feet at one time, but cattle have destroyed the markers. The few tombstones that remain were scattered over a wide area.

#### NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

## by Patricia Chadwell

The editor of one of our more "elite" genealogical magazines took libraries to task for making photocopies for researchers in his Winter 1972 issue, basing his case on a decision currently being appealed by the United States Government, in which the National Library of Medicine was found guilty of infringement of copyright in photocopying and disseminating articles from medical journals to physicians across the nation. He states that "Libraries do not have the right to make photocopies of copyrighted material merely because the magazine is in the library; they, too, must seek permission. Otherwise, they are in violation of the copyright laws. Your local librarian may not set aside the Laws [sic] of the United States Government." (Rodney Hartwell, <u>The Colonial Genealogist</u>, Volume 4, No. 3, Winter 1972)

We take issue with Mr. Hartwell only because the question he raises is one which is apt to recur frequently during the next few years, and one which affects the library user (you) as well as the library profession.

The right of the researcher to make single copies of copyrighted material for his own private use has never been questioned. You, the researcher, are free to take any book or periodical in the library to the self-operated copiers and make one copy of any material contained therein for your own private use, in lieu of copying it out by hand. The right of the individual to copy copyrighted material for private use has been upheld by the courts repeatedly.

There is nothing in either United States copyright law (Title 17, U. S. Code) or in the protocols of the Universal Copyright Convention which prohibits individuals from copying for private use from copyrighted material, or libraries, as the agents for individual researchers from so doing. Even the court decision which is not in question (and which is by no means final) may not affect individual libraries, since the National Library of Medicine disseminates hundreds of copies of the same article, and is the initiating party for the service, rather than the agent of the researcher. This service, although free to the medical researchers, compares with the action of a so-called genealogical publisher who sold photocopies from genealogical magazines and even whole books (including the Fort Worth Genealogical Society's publications) as original publications.

A leading library publication, the <u>Wilson Library Bulletin</u>, sums it all up in an article on the National Library of Medicine suit in the April 1972 issue (p. 679), "Until legislation defines the limits on photoduplicating copyrighted materials, or a pill is invented for the xerographic process, decisions on reproduction rest fully with libraries and librarians."

The American Association for State and Local History publishes a series of Technical Leaflets, which appear each month in <u>History News</u>, and are also available from the Society as separate publications. Several of them would be of interest to the genealogist; the latest of these is Technical Leaflet No. 9, "Cemetery Transcribing; Preparations and Procedures." The compiler, John J. Newman, Indiana State Archivist, is an avid genealogist whose wide field experience in transcribing cemeteries has produced a most comprehensive guide. He covers methods of locating <sup>Cem</sup>eteries, plotting them, copying stones (including difficult inscriptions), making a plat, and recording the information in the most useful fashion.

The Ione Adamson Nolan Memorial Collection was dedicated on July 14, and will be on display as a unit in the Southwest and Genealogy Department until September 1. Books from the collection will be placed on a single table, and must be used at that table. After September 1, they will be integrated into the genealogy collection.

Because the Nolan Books have been in processing, few other books have been received. For that reason, we will omit the list of new books this month in favor of a column in the November issue which will be mostly a list of new books.

One of the few new arrivals which should be mentioned, however, is <u>Texas Pioneers from Poland</u> by Jacek Przygoda. (San Antonio, Texas, Polish-American Center, 2611 Mission Road, 78214, 1971. \$6.95) The author is a professor at Loyola University of Los Angeles. He has drawn heavily on archival material and interviews, as well as published sources to produce a book which should be consulted by every Texan of Polish Descent.

Przygoda concentrates on Polish enclaves in San Antonio, Panna Maria, and Thurber, with one chapter on Poles in the remainder of the state. From this chapter, we learn, for instance, that Fort Worth had, in 1908, about 200 Poles working in the stockyards, and we find a list of sixteen of them who established a national society.

### Biblioprints

There are upwards of a thousand persons listed, many with biographical information. The author includes the following tables or appendices: 1860 Tax Assessments in Karnes County (Poles only); Poles in the 1860 census of Bexar County; Poles in the 1860 census of Karnes County; Poles on the 1876 tax list of Karnes County; Poles in the 1860 census of DeWitt County; and Polish Coal Miners in Thurber, 1890-1920.

The major flaw in the book, from a genealogical standpoint, is that the author has not included those persons whose names appear in the above tables or the many lists which are included in the book in the index. Since the subject entries in the index are also poor, the book will have to be studied carefully page by page.

Two new volumes in the <u>Missouri Pioneers</u> series, which is compiled and published by <u>Miss Nadine Hodges and Mrs. Howard</u> W. Woodruff, have arrived. Volumes XIV and XV include material from the following counties: Franklin, Pike, Holt, Cooper, St. Clair, Macon, Howell, Jackson, Gasconade, Worth, Taney, St. Louis County (does not include the city of St. Louis), Sullivan, Greene, Lincoln, Madison, and Howard. No researcher with Missouri families will want to overlook this fine series.

A number of members of the society have expressed concern about the Southwest and Genealogy Department's new policy of circulating material in the Southwest Collection. The circulation of this material will in no way affect genealogical The Southwest collection consists primarily of research. books which are the "readable" as opposed to the "research" type. There are several fine research libraries in the state which aim at complete research collections of Texana. Over the years, the administration and staff of the Fort Worth Public Library have come to feel that maintaining such a library is not the function of a public library, so, in order to promote the use of the Southwest collection, which is negligible in its present state, books from the collection will circulate. The exceptions to this policy will be those books which have a very great value as collectors items, books which are of a reference nature, and those books which are valuable for genealogical research (such as Texas county histories), which will be reclassified into the genealogy collection. All this will take time, and may mean that certain classes of materials that are usually in the room may be in the stacks, as the county histories are at present. The staff will be happy to retrieve any of them for you at any time, however.

Some duplicates of county histories have been made circulating, which may help some of you who would like to take them home to read at your leisure. NOTES ON ALABAMIANS IN OBITUARIES

After entering the river where the rite was administered, he had to walk in his wet clothes a mile before he could change them for dry ones. - Advocate." (March 13, 1872; 2.3)

"Sister WEST died at the residence of her son-in-law, PETER TUMBLESON, SEN., February 27th, 1872. She was about 84 years of age, and had long been a member of the Baptist church. She was a member of Shiloh Church, Atascosa County, at the time of her death...." Signed, 'L E. PIERCE (Mar 20, 1872; 3.2)

ALSEY H. ALLEN "was born in Elizabeth District, South Carolina" on the 7th day of August, 1817. Early in life he moved to Alabama and settled in Lowndes County. He was engaged in the mercantile business in Benton for some years, and near there married Miss M. C. STEADMAN. In 1850 he moved to Texas and spent most of his remaining years at Willow Springs, Milam County. On Thursday, March 8th, he died of pneumonia." Mentioned: family. (March 27, 1872; 3.2)

Elder THOS A POTTS died the 7th inst. at his residence in Goliad County, Texas. At the time of his death he had the pastoral care of the church at Black Jack Grove in Goliad County, and he was also pastor of the church at Trout Creek, for several months past. He leaves a wife. Signed, G. W. JONES, Oakville, Texas, March 14, '72. (April 3, 1872; 2.6)

"Elder T. A. POTTS was born in Easton, Penn., April 9, A.D. 1832 where he spent his youthful days with his parents, until 1849, when they emigrated to Texas, bringing with them their hopeful boy. Soon after realizing his majority, he united himself with MARY A. HOLLAN, an amiable young lady, and the

daughter of a minister, WADE H. HOLLAN, in the holy estate of matrimony. He united with the Church of God at Hebron, Dewitt County, Texas, in 1855, and in 1864 the same church licensed him to preach. He was ordained to the full work of God by German Church, Lavaca County, Texas, in 1867. After which providence directed his steps to the South-west part of Goliad County, where, after the organization of Black Jack and Trout Creek churches last summer, he was called to supply them as pastor, which he accepted and zealously engaged in the work." He died March 2, 1872. "In his death the surviving mother lost a dutiful son - the wife a devoted...husband, the children a loving father.... Signed, L. S. COX. Resolutions adopted by Black Jack Church on Saturday before the 4th Lord's day in March, 1872 follow. NANCY E. DAVIS, wife of C. S. DAVIS, died in Lavaca County, Texas, April 5th. She was "a daughter of JOSEPH G. FORD, now living in Illinois, where she made a profession of religion, in the month of August, 1868." Brother DAVIS left Illinois last October, for Texas, in search of health for his companion. "A short time before her death, she requested that her corps[e] be carried into Salem Church and her funeral to be preached by the writer." She left a little girl two years and six months old. Signed, A. H. FARRINGTON (April 24, 1872; 3.4)

"Dr. J. M. LAWRENCE...was born in Green County, Ga., 1855, February 6th. Moved to Rusk County, Texas, 1860, when at the expiration of one year, he removed to Tyler, Smith County, at which place he departed this life, on the first of April, after an illness of some four days - aged fifty-seven years, one month, and twenty-five days. In eulogy, the writer states that the deceased lived to pess through one of the most interesting revivals the Baptist church in this place has ever realized "and it was his pleasure to see the last one of his dear children, who had reached the years of maturity, join the church of his choice." Mentioned: wife, sister, children. Signed, M. "Milledgeville (Ga.) papers please copy." (April 24, 1872; 3.4)

"Died. Tuesday morning, May 7th, in the city of Houston, ALICE, infant daughter of B. S. and HATTIE L. FITZGERALD, aged five months." (May 1, 1872; 3.4)

WILLIAM MUCKLE, Esq., died at his residence in Grimes County, Texas, January 15th, 1872, in the 82d year of his age. He was born near London, England, on the 31st of August, 1790. At the age of 11 years he came to America with his mother and step-father and located in Newberry District, South Carolina. October 8th, 1818 he married his wife, who survives him. In 1842 he was baptized into the fellowship of Concord Church, Alabama. In 1845 he was ordained to the office of deacon in said church. In 1860 he removed to Texas and located in Grimes County, and united with Post Oak Grove Church, of which he remained a member until his death. "Bro. MUCKLE has been a cripple for about 3 years previous to his death, caused by a fall from a carriage...He leaves an aged wife and several sons and daughters...." Signed, W. H. D. "<u>Working Christian</u> please copy." (May 22, 1872; 3.5)

The Baptist church at Pilot Point, Denton County, Texas, adopted resolutions in memory of "our beloved brother and pastor, ELDER ASA DAVIS." One resolution asks that <u>The Baptist</u>, Memphis, Tennessee, be requested to copy the same, "as the aged father of Bro. DAVIS, and all of his brothers and sisters but one, live in Tennessee." Done in conference 6th day of April, 1872. Signed, JOHN C. HUNTON, Moderator; T. G. MATTISON, Church Clerk. (May 29, 1872; 2.4)

Mrs. R. A. MYER died in Plantersville, Grimes County, Texas, February 1872 [no day]. She "was born in Quebec, Canada, June, 1803 [no day]; professed faith...and was baptized into the fellowship of Spring Branch Church in 1829; about ten years a member of the First Baptist Church, Mobile, Ala.; removed to Texas 1857; located near Plantersville, Grimes County, Texas." She was in the organization of Plantersville Baptist Church. Mentioned: children and grandchildren. Signed, W. H. DODSON. (June 5, 1872; 3.4)

BERTRAND McCLOSKEY, aged 60 years, died in the town of Orange, Texas, on the 29th of May, 1872. He was "born in Ireland, emigrated to America while yet in his boyhood, professed religion in 1864, and was a consistent member of the Missionary Baptist Church. In 1858 he was married to Mrs. S. H. MILHELM, daughter of Bro. JOHN McDONNALD. His affectionate wife survives... Bro. McCLOSKEY was a citizen of Milam, Sabine County, for many years, got into a lingering state, and came to this place with the hope of regaining his health but continued to linger until he died." Signed, Wm. C. COLLINS, Orange, Texas, May, 1872. (June 19, 1872)

HERNDON GREEN died of pneumonia April 9, 1872, age 86 years, 1 month, and 6 days. He was "born in Amelia County, Virginia, on the 3d of March, 1786, was married to SARAH A. JOHNS in 1813, professed faith...in 1821, was baptized into the fellowship of the Sandy Creek Baptist Church by Elder ABNER WATKINS, and set apart [t]o Deacon's office in 1822; emigrated to Franklin County, Tenn., and united with Macedonia Church in 1832. In 1855 he emigrated to Burleson County, Texas, and united with the Dove Baptist Church." He leaves his aged companion and seven children. Signed, Pastor. (June 19, 1872; 3.4)

"NANCY GHENT...was born in South Carolina in 1796, was married three times, and survived her third husband. She emigrated to Alabama in middle life, where she...joined the M. E. Church, but was never satisfied with her baptism. She emigrated to Texas in 1868, and [in] 1871 she united with the Dove Baptist Church at Caldwell, Burleson County, Texas...." She died at the residence of her son-in-law on February 18, 1872, age 76 years, 11 months and 16 days. She had been in Caldwell but a few months. Signed, Pastor. (June 19, 1872; 3.4)

Little HENRY, son of R. H. and MARY SMITH, died in Weberville, Travis County, Texas, May 28, 1872, aged one year and eight months. Signed, A. J. N. (June 19, 1872; 3.4)

Resolutions to the memory of JOHN M. KEMP, who died March 1, 1872. Signed by JNO. U. P. CRAMER, JNO. E. TYSON, JAS. C. COWARD, Committee. Certified as a true copy from the Lodge records by ROBT B. MARTIN, Secretary, St. Paul's Lodge No. 177 [Masonic], Port Sullivan, April 25, 1872. (June 26, 1872; 3.4)

"MARY ANN McDANIEL, wife of Elder E. McDANIEL, of Burnett County, Texas, was drowned on the 4th of May, 1872, in a pool of water near her residence... In her death, her husband has lost an affectionate wife, her seven children a devoted mother, the Zion Baptist Church a zealous and exemplary member...." (July 10, 1872; 3.3)

Little HENRY, infant son of W. H. and JOSEPHINE PARKS, died in Fairfield, Texas, 27 June 1872, aged 1 year, 6 months and 14 days. (July 17, 1872; 3.4)

BENJAMIN G. JACKSON died May 24, 1872. He was born in Washington County, Illinois, August 19, 1836. He came to Texas in 1858, and married in Grayson County February 24, 1861, Miss RUTH MILLER, daughter of Elder NOAH MILLER. In July of the same year he was baptized by Elder F. B. McCOMB into the fellowship of the Baptist church at Farmington, in that county. In January, 1870, he removed to Bremond, and by letter joined the church at that place, of which he was a member until his death. Mentioned: widow, RUTH. Signed, W. C. BOONE, Pastor. "Sherman Courier please copy." (July 17, 1872; 3.4)

Mrs. ANNIE L. FOLLETT died at San Luis, Texas, 17 April, in the 77th year of her age. She was born in the province of New Brunswick 9 January 1795. "She became united in 1815 with the Baptist church of which her father and mother were many years previous to their decease exemplary members. The writer's first recollection of her as a member dates as far back as the year 1828, when she communed with the first Baptist Church in Charlestown, Massachusetts, then under the pastoral care of the Rev. HENRY JACKSON. Subsequently on removing to New York, she joined the Stanton Street Church, Rev. Mr. BENEDICT [as stated]. She removed to Texas in the early part of the year 1839, sometime after which she became a member of the church in Galveston, of which the late JAS HUCKINS was pastor. Living so remote from the church, her opportunities of attending were few .... She leaves behind a family of four sons, all of her daughters, four in number, p[r]eceding her...." (July 24, 1872; 3.4)

THOMAS F. CANNON, son (and only child) of JAMES F. and JULIA C. CANNON, aged 2 years, 8 months and 4 days, died at Columbus, Brazoria County, Texas. [No date.] "It was the writer's duty to officiate a year ago at the funeral services of the mother." Signed, M. V. SMITH, Brenham, July 10, 1872. (July 24, 1872; 3.4)

Mrs. SUSAN DANIEL died July 6, 1872. She was "born March 3d, 1812, in Morgan County, Georgia, was baptized into the fellowship of the Antioch Church in 1831. Her maiden name was RANDLE. She was married to ASBURY DANIEL, a deacon of the Baptist church, in 1830. In 1833 the family moved to western Georgia, where they remained until 1845. The six years following they resided in southern Arkansas, since which their lot has been cast with the Baptists of Texas. Her membership was with Independence Church until she obtained a letter of dismission in 1860. She was received into the fellowship of the Waco Baptist Church in 1870, where her membership remained until her death.... [There follows a long account of her relationship with Baptist churches, the Okmulgee Association, her love of peace, the orphan, etc. Signed, HARVEY CARROLL, Pastor, Waco Baptist Church. "The Christian Index and South Western Baptist will please copy." (July 24, 1872; 3.4)

SALLIE N. KENNARD, wife of JOHN R. KENNARD, of Navasota, and daughter of Judge E. B. and Mrs. M. A. NOBLE, of Houston, Texas" (by whom she was named SARAH REBEKAH)," died June 8, 1872, aged 39 years, 5 months and 4 days. Mentioned: three older children, a niece, and youngest child, LUCY, then at a neighbor's house. Signed, J. R. K. (Aug 14, 1872; 3.2)

SARAH KEENAN, wife of THOMAS KEENAN, died March 21, 1872, at the age of 65 years. "Her maiden name was SARAH MCALISTER she was born in the State of Ohio in 1807, and was married to THOMAS KEENAN October 1, 1829. Emigrated to Texas in 1842, and settled in what is now Dallas County, 12 miles from Dallas. She professed faith...and joined the Union Church of Baptists May 10, 1846, the same day on which the church was organized, and was baptized one month later by Elder DAVID MYERS, the pastor of the church. The writer was requested by our dear brother KEENAN and family to come to the old mansion where brother and sister KEENAN have lived for near thirty years, and preach a funeral discourse. She was the mother of twelve children, five of whom died under the age of 13 months, and of the other two who are dead, one died at home...the other died in the army, far from home, near Austin, Arkansas." Signed, J. M. MYRES. (Sept 18, 1872; 3.3)

Mrs. M. M. INGE died at the residence of Mrs. S. GENNILL, in Navasota, Texas, on August 27, 1872, in the 50th year of her age. She was the wife of Dr. R. J. INGE, and was a native of the state of Alabama. For more than 30 years she had been a member of the Baptist church. Signed, J. H. S. (Sept 18, 1872; 3.4) Died, in Harris County, Texas, 26 August, LULA WEST, aged 19 months and 9 days. Also: On the 30th of August, JIMMIE WEST, aged 5 years, 7 months and 19 days. They were the children of Bro. J. J. WEST, deacon of Willow Creek Church. Signed, J. M. PERRY. (Sept 18, 1872; 3.4)

THOMAS DEAN was born in Smith County, Tennessee, February 4, 1814. He was baptized into the fellowship of the Defeated Creek Baptist Church November, 1841; was married December 31, 1843, to Miss PARSETTA PISTOLE: removed to Simpson County, Kentucky and joined the Shady Grove Church in 1851. In 1852 he emigrated to Grayson County, Texas, and united with the Kentucky Town in 1858... His health having failed during the present year, he went to Kentucky, hoping that, by so doing, it might be restored.... He died in Simpson County, July 30, 1872... Resolutions adopted by Kentucky Town Baptist Church September 7, 1872. Signed, J. W. CONNELLY, Moderator; J. A. LINDSEY, Clerk. (Oct 9, 1872; 3.3-4)

Mrs. LAURA THERESE CAVE, wife of E. W. CAVE, died in Houston. Texas, August 26, 1872, aged 32 years. She "was born at Nacogdoches, Texas, on the 3d day of October, 1840. She was of German parentage, her father, Hon. ADOLPHUS STERNE, being a native of Cologne, and her mother, EVE C. R. RUFF, a native of Esslingen. Judge STERNE was among the earliest settlers of eastern Texas, a man of high cultivation and refined tastes, and universally beloved. Dispensing the generous hospitality for which Nacogdoches has always been celebrated, his house was a point of concentration for the most distinguished men and women of Texas. Though gifted in a marked degree (the spell of music seeming to woo her to triumphs of art) the happy circle of home was not broken to obtain an education abroad. She grew to young womanhood amid the scenes dear to her happy childhood. Her beauty and vivacity were conspicuous in a society famed throughout Texas for the loveliness of its When not seventeen, she took upon herself the duties women. of a wife. Her husband, then struggling in the ranks of Texas journalism, found in his wife a true helpmeet. In the winter of 1859 she removed with her husband, to Austin.... After a short residence in Galveston, Houston became her permanent home, in 1862." Signed, E. W. C. (Oct 9, 1872; 3.4) Note: Although mentioned as a wife, mother and daughter, children are not otherwise referred to. MBS

Miss ANNIE M. ELSBURY, daughter of THOMAS and MARY A. ELSBURY, died in this city on Sunday, October 18th, aged 17 years. Signed, J. T. ZEALY. (Oct 23, 1872; 3.3-4)

Capt. HENRY SAULS died in Washington County, Texas, at the home of his father-in-law, JOSHUA PALMER, on May 21, 1872. "He remained with his parents, JOHN and PATIENCE SAULS, many years in Jackson County, Georgia, and was afterwards engaged in various enterprises in Alabama, Mississippi and Arkansas, came to Texas after the war, and settled in Washington County, in 1868, and married. His widow, with a... daughter three years old, now resides with her father-in-law, whose post-office is Washington, Washington County, Texas." Signed, D. P. EVERETT, M. G. "The <u>Baptist</u> and <u>Christian Index</u> will please copy." (Oct 23, 1872; 3.4)

Mrs. MARY B. ABBOTT, wife of JOHNSON ABBOTT, died at her home near Montgomery on the 6th inst., in the thirty-fifth year of her age. She removed with her husband "here" in 1859. She was baptized into the fellowship of Montgomery Church in 1851 by Elder JONAS JOHNSTON. Mentioned: husband, son, and the infant of only a few days. Signed, A Friend. Montgomery, Texas, Oct. 25, 1872. (Nov 6, 1872; 3.4)

E. C. GARRELL died at his residence in Washington County, Texas, October 26, 1872. He came from near Buena Vista, Marion County, Georgia, to Texas, near four years ago. He had resided in this county ever since he came. "Brother Garrell left a large and dependent family." Signed, J. E. P. (Nov 6, 1872; 3.4)

REV. S. R. FREEMAN. "Just as we go to press, we receive a telegram dated November 19th announcing: 'Rev. S. R. FREEMAN died this morning.' (Dec 4, 1872; 2.6) Note: An obituary has not been found, but in a letter to the editor, W. T. RUSSELL, Ag't Domestic Missions, states that he knew him [FREEMAN] in boyhood days. "My father, Elder T. J. RUSSELL, preached often at the private residence of Dr. FREEMAN'S father in Tennessee."

JOHN Y. HILL "died at my residence" in Anderson, Grimes County, Texas, October 30, 1872, in his twenty-fifth year. Mentioned: two brothers. Signed, JONAS JOHNSTON. (Jan. 1. 1873; 3.4)

ELLEN McKNIGHT died at Independence in December 1872. Mentioned (in long eulogy): father, mother, brothers, sisters. "Her teacher from her earliest youth pays this sad tribute to her memory...." Signed, H. C. (Jan 1, 1873; 3.4)

C. G. BRINSON, M. D., of Bastrop County, Texas, died at Monteray, Mexico, 17 December 1872. "Bro. BRINSON was cut down in the prime of manhood by consumption. The balmy breezes of Mexico were sought, that life might be prolonged, but to no purpose... Perryville Church lost her right hand pillar in him." Signed, A. J. H. (Feb 5, 1873; 3.4)

H. F. B(uckner) writes, under the title, <u>Creek Items for</u> <u>the Week</u>, "HARRISON KANNARD, brother of Eld. JUDGE KANNARD, died of pneumonia last week. -- HOPETHLE, an old native preacher, was buried last Saturday...." (Mar 12, 1873; 2.6)

PERRY, GIBSON, BURFORD, JOHNSON, JORDAN, COUCH, MOUNCE, EMBRY

#### HEASLET, SPIVEY, JOHNSTON, RECTOR, SPURGEON, BOATMAN

William M. C. C. HEASLET and his wife, Lucinda ?, moved from Talladega, Alabama, to Nacogdoches County, Texas, about 1850-1851. He was on 1850 census Talladega County, but wrote to my grandfather in August, 1852 that he had purchased land six miles from Nacogdoches and walked back and forth doing carpenter work in town to pay for his land. He died in Texas 27 November 1877, but no record of a will or administration is to be found in Nacogdoches County. In 1867 and 1870 he lived in Precinct 1, Nacogdoches County, near his sons and daughters. William Heaslet was a son of Benjamin C. HEASLET, Sr., born Tennessee 1780, died Alabama 1837. William and Lucinda HEASLET were the parents of four known children: Lucinda C., Francis L., Louisa C., and James Marion.

Lucinda C. HEASLET married in Talladega County, Ala. 23 December 1849 Harvey R. M. SPIVEY. They were on 1860 census of Nacogdoches County, but were not found on census for 1870 or 1880. The court records of Talladega County, Ala. show that Lucinda (Heaslet) SPIVEY was living in Texas in 1895, when she received her share of the estate of her aunt, Mary HEASLET. Can anyone tell me where the SPIVEY family lived after leaving Nacogdoches County?

James Marion HEASLET married Mary ? , and they, with their son, Columbus, also moved from Talladega County, Ala. to Nacogdoches County, Texas, where he continued to live in 1870. Court records show that in 1895 he lived in Arkansas, but not where.

Louisa C. HEASLET married in Nacogdoches County, Texas, 27 July 1852 Robert H. JOHNSTON, and may have remained there, as in 1895 she still lived in Texas when she received her share of her aunt's estate in Alabama.

#### TARRANT COUNTY, TEXAS MARRIAGE BOOK I

### Compiled by Patricia Chadwell

This is the first installment of the recorded marriages of Tarrant County, Texas. It contains those marriages on record for 1876. They are found in Marriage Book I at the Tarrant County Courthouse.

The Tarrant County Courthouse burned on the night of March 29, 1876, destroying the records in the District Clerk's office, which at that time would have contained all of the records most valuable to the genealogist.

Marriage Book I includes several licenses issued before the fire, since some of the ministers and J.P.'s performing marriages were very slow in making their returns. The marriages in this and in subsequent installments are in the order in which they appear in the book except where late returns make the years overlap. Some 1876 marriages were returned as late as July 1877.

I plan to copy the marriages year by year, with the hope of publishing one year per issue of FOOTPRINTS. In the meantime, I am making an attempt to reconstruct the missing marriage records for the first twenty-six years of Tarrant County's existence from other sources, and would appreciate any information that our readers can send me.

# In Memory Of My Three Children

"ELVIRA ELIZABETH ANDERSON died at my residence near Cameron, Milam County, Texas, February the 3d, 1872, in the 26th year of her age. She had been a member of the Baptist Church for about 8 years.

"MALVINA KIDD, wife of T. W. KIDD, died near Cameron on the 8th day of December 1872. She left an infant 8 months old. She was in the 24th year of her age, and had been a member of the Baptist Church for 7 years.

"WILLIAM WIRT ANDERSON died at Port Sullivan, Milam County, Texas on the 1st day of January, 1873. He was in the 23d year of his age and had been a member of the Baptist Church over 5 years."

Signed, T. M. ANDERSON. (Jan 22, 1873; 3.5)

MRS. R. L. FAISON, wife of JAMES I. FAISON, died at her residence at Ladonia, Texas 28 December 1872, aged thirtyeight years and six months. "For twenty years she had lived an exemplary member in the Baptist church...she had suffered many bereavements...having consigned to the tomb three of the four children given her....In the death of our dear sister... our brother and dear little IVIE have lost a wife and mother ...." Signed: R. J. P. (Feb 5, 1873; 3.4)

"WILLIAM A. BRADFORD...was born in Tennessee, but removed some twenty years ago to this state, settling where he has since resided at what is now the junction of the International and Great Northern Railroad, in Smith County. About fourteen years ago he was baptized into the fellowship of the church at Knoxville, where his membership remained till a church was constituted near his residence some two or three years ago. His death was sudden and unexpected by the hand of violence. Arising early on the morning of November 13th, he found a stranger taking corn from his crib. He arrested him, and at the mans request they went to the camps where the man had been staying; entering the tent he seized a sixteen shooting rifle and fired, inflicting two mortal wounds, which resulted in almost instantaneous death. The murderer entered the thicket, and before the bystanders had recovered from their surprise, disappeared, leaving no trace of name, who he was, or from where he came. Brother BRADFORD was in the forty-third year of his life, leaving a wife and several sons." Signed: J. A. K. (Feb 5, 1873; 3.4)

MISS JULIA Z. LAUDERDALE died at Waco, Texas 5 December 1872, where she was a student at Waco University. She was born in Washington County 26 January 1858, and was baptized into the fellowship of Gay Hill Baptist Church in July 1871. Her mother survives. Mentioned: her father, and her sister, deceased three years. [See obituaries of LILLIE A LAUDERDALE and of JOHN HAWKINS LAUDERDALE, Footprints, Volume 14, No. 4, November 1971, p. 159; Volume 15, No. 1, February 1972, p. 2.] (Feb 19, 1873; 3.4)

COL. M. C. ROGERS, of Huntsville, Texas, died February 15th. "He was one of the oldest citizens of this city, being in his 78th year, and over 30 years a citizen of this place. He filled with honor and fidelity, for successive terms, the highest and most responsible offices in this city; and also some of honor and trust in the State. Col. Rogers...has gone on to join all his children save one...." Signed: D. K. MORELAND "The Baptist of Memphis will please copy." (Feb 19, 1873; 3.4)

Resolution to the memory of JOHN DRISDALE, deceased, member Lafayette Lodge No. 34 [Masonic]. Signed: R. T. BRADSHAW, ISAAC SELLERS, A. E. WILLENBERG, Committee. La Grange, Texas, Jan. 15, 1873.

HENRY THOMAS SPENCER was born June 3d, 1848 and died January 8th, 1873, in Limestone County, Texas, aged 24 years, 7 months, and 5 days. In his thirteenth year, he was baptized into the fellowship of Pleasant Grove Church. On Sept. 12, 1871, he, with others, entered into the organization of Antioch Church at Thornton, Limestone County, was elected clerk, and filled this position until the day he died. [Parents mentioned.] Resolutions, which follow, were signed: R. F. MATTISON, Moderator, JOHN RASCO, Clerk pro tem [church not stated, but probably Antioch MBS]. (March 12, 1873; 3.4)

W. A. MILNER, M.D., late of Houston, died at Fairfield 31 January 1873. He was 52 years of age. He leaves a wife and seven children. (Feb 5, 1873; 3.4)

NORTON RIGHT, of Harris County, died February 27, 1873, of pneumonia. He was a member and the clerk of the church on Cypress. (March 26, 1873; 3.4)

"JONH G. FELTON died at his home in Starrville, Smith County, Texas, December 16th, 1872....He was born in Anderson District, South Carolina September 4th, 1812; joined the Baptist church in the 18th year of his age; married MISS DOROTHY JONES November 6th, 1833; was for several years a resident of Georgia; moved to Texas in 1858; was ordained deacon at Hopewell in 1859; and was acting deacon at Bethel Church [when he died]." He leaves a wife and five children. Signed: H. E. C., Pastor. (March 26, 1873; 3.4)

EZRA JACK LUMPKIN died at his residence in Milam County, Texas 26 January 1873. He was born 19 May 1826, and was baptized into the fellowship of the church at Macedonia, Georgia, in the year 1846. "Bro. LUMPKIN was a son of ELD. ELIJAH LUMPKIN, of Rome, Georgia." Signed: A. E. VANDIVERE. "Christian Index please copy." (April 17, 1873; 3.4)

A. S. LIPSCOMBE died at his residence near Montgomery, April 1, 1873. Mentioned: wife and children. Resolutions drawn up by a committee of Montgomery Lodge No. 25, F. A. & A. M. signed by JAS BOONE, M. H. DAVIS, and R. F. OLIVER. (April 17, 1873)

"To the memory of Bro. ALEXANDER PATRICK, who was born in Kentucky, Nov. 14th, A.D., 1794, made a profession of religion at the age of twenty-five, moved to Texas A.D. 1838, and was one of the organizing members of the church at Leona; and has lived a consistent member of the same until his death, which took place Nov. 18th, 1872." Signed: F. M. HINES, R. B. NANCE, W. B. RIGBY, Committee [of the church at Leona, who adopted the resolutions]. (April 24, 1873; 3.4)

MRS. MARY ANN DUDLEY died at her residence in Denton County on the 24th ult [April 24]. She was the eldest daughter of JOHN and MARY JACKSON, and wife of W. R. DUDLEY. "Sister DUDLEY was born in Devonshire, England, February 15th...1837; emigrated to Dallas County, Texas in 1848 with her parents and settled near Trinity Mills. She was married to Mr. W. R. DUDLEY August 22d...1855, with whom she lived happily until her death. She professed religion and was baptized by the writer...1864." Survived by husband and four children. Signed: J. M. MYERS. (May 8, 1873; 3.3)

ADELAIDE BARKER died at Millican on the 21st ult. [April 21]. Mentioned: husband (in old age); children. Signed: L. L. REES, Millican. (May 15, 1873; 3.3)

MRS. ADDIE B. TOWNSEND, wife of W. K. TOWNSEND, died at the residence of her father, in Harris County, on the 22d ult. [April 22]. She was born in Harrison County, Texas, daughter of the Rev. J. M. and MRS. N. B. PERRY. She was baptized into the fellowship of Harmony Baptist Church, Grimes County, Texas, on July 3, 1870, by Elder G. W. GREEN. "In the fall of 1870, her father removed to Harris County, where, on the 22d of May, 1871, she was married to the writer." Signed: W. K. T. Willow Creek, April 30th, 1873. (May 15, 1873; 3.3)

"ELI W. JONES was born in Jackson County, Georgia, May 14th ...1800. At 15 years of age he moved to Illinois, where he

lived until 1858, when he came to Texas. He lived in different parts of the State, until 1861, when he came to this county, where he breathed his last April 16th, 1873. Aged 72 years, 11 months and 20 days. Brother JONES embraced religion about the year 1833. He lived a consistent Methodist for a number of years, when he joined the Baptists. He lived to see his whole family embrace religion." Signed: THOS. H. COMPERE, his pastor. (May 22, 1873; 3.2)

La Grange, May 13th, 1873. Dear Bro. Link: -- Within the last four or five months we have been made to mourn the loss of ten members from our families and neighborhood; six of whom were active members of Plum Grove Baptist Church. Sister NANCY SCALLORN died of hemorrhage of the lungs; Bro. SCHURTZ, a German brother, from a fall in a well; Sisters LIZZIE and SANDY DRISDALE from congestion; Bro. CALVIN KIRK, from measles and pneumonia; the others from congestion and measles." JOHN DRISDALE - a deacon of Plum Grove Church - father - husband. CALVIN KIRK was likewise - and a member of the church near four years. NANCY SCALLORN, SANDY and LIZZIE DRISDALE..."the three young sisters." Signed: PINCKNEY HARRIS (May 22, 1873; 3.2)

EMMA HILL, Sunday School teacher, died at Brenham. She was born June 18, 1849, and was the youngest daughter of NOAH and T. C. HILL. Her father, who died in 1867, was one of the pioneer Texas preachers, and in 1862 was permitted to baptize his daughter. "The surviving family of Bro. HILL now consists of the widow, one son, and three daughters." Signed: M. V. SMITH. (May 29, 1873; 2.5) [The only clue to date of death is in the headline, which reads, "May-day In Brenham - Death Of A Sunday School Teacher."]

ALBERT S. LIPSCOMB died at his residence in Montgomery County, Texas April 1, 1873, in his 53d year. For over 30 years he had been a consistent Baptist. He had been deacon of the church in Montgomery since 1861. He leaves a wife, a son, a daughter. Signed: JONAS LIPSCOMB. (June 5, 1873; 3.3)

ARTHUR W. ROBBINS "was laid away in our village graveyard on last Thursday, (May 15th)." He was a member of the Erosophian Society. "Taken from us we have sustained an irreparable loss, in common with the Temperance Council, Sabbath School, and Baptist Church." (June 19, 1873; 3.3)

"Died, June 4th, 1873, in Larissa, SUSAN C., wife of Dr. L. J. ROBINSON, after an illness of ten days. Sister ROBINSON was born in Butts County, Georgia February 24th, 1831. She made a profession of religion and united with the Baptist church at about the age of seventeen....She left a husband and five children." [A poem follows.] Signed: J. A. K.

Tribute of respect to the memory of ELDER B. P. FERRELL, who died at his home 28 November 1872, in the 65th year of his age. Signed: J. M. WEBB, Moderator; WILLIAM LAMB, Clerk, Friendship Baptist Church of Christ, Freestone County, Texas. May 10, 1873. (June 5, 1873; 3.3)

MRS. BETTIE D. UPSHAW, wife of ROBERT L. UPSHAW, Esq., died at Giddings March 23, 1873. She was the oldest daughter of the Hon. ABNER S. LIPSCOMB (deceased) and his wife, Mrs. MARY P. LIPSCOMB. She was born June 10, 1846. "Possessed of a native intellect of high power, cultivated by reading, study and society - noble in person, attractive in manner - she was adapted to enliven and adorn society." Signed: W. C. C. (July 10, 1873; 3.4)

"MRS. FRANCIS E. HADLEY died in this city on the 21st of June 1873. Her parents were JOHN J. and ELLEN McCULLOUGH. The deceased was born in South Carolina April 26th, 1848, and at the time of her death was 30 years, 1 month and 26 days of age. At the early age of eleven she united with the Methodists in the State of Georgia. On the 6th of May, 1856, she was united in marriage to DAVIS B. HADLEY. Some years after her marriage she was led by a careful study of the Bible to connect herself with the Baptist church, and died in the fellowship of this church....Though a stranger in our midst, she had won the hearts of all who had made her acquaintance. Tenderly nursed by her mother and husband .... " Mentioned: children. Signed: J. T. ZEALY. (July 24, 1873; 3.3) [The date of birth of the deceased was obviously not 1848. The date was no doubt 1843, and mis-read by the printer, or the abstractor. MBS ]

"Died in Pennington, Trinity County, on Sunday, June 22d, 1873, J. R. G. HOLT, our darling babe. Aged 7 months...." Signed, A. J. HOLT. (July 24, 1873; 3.3)

MISS MATTIE M. PARKER died near Pittsville, Texas July 23, in the sixteenth year of her age. She was a daughter of DAVID PARKER, and a student at Waco University. Resolutions adopted at a meeting of the Pittsville Temperance Society on July 26 were signed: JOHN W. EVERETT, L. WARREN MILLER, W. C. MAY, ROBERTA DRURY, EMMA H. BROOKSHIRE, Committee; ALEX. WADE, President; S. W. MILLER, Secretary. (Aug 14, 1873; 3.2)

Died, July 18th, 1873, WILLIAM F. HARDEN, son of EDWARD H. HARDEN and FANNIE C. HARDEN, of Waco, Texas, aged 11 years, 4 months and 15 days. The deceased was born in Waco. Mentioned: his widowed mother, brother, and sister. Signed: J. H. S. (Aug 14, 1873; 3.2,3)

Died, at the residence of her father, MR. ELISHA FLOYD, near Anderson, Texas, on the 21st of July 1873, MRS. SALLIE A. JETER, the wife of J. R. JETER, Esq., of Sherman, Texas. Mentioned: married but a few months earlier. The writer had known her from girlhood. Signed: J. H. S., Anderson, Texas. (Aug 14, 1873; 3.3)

Died, in Bastrop, Texas, May 10th, 1873, MARY A., only child of B. D. and DRU J. ORGAIN - aged 16 months and nine

days. "Observer (Louisville), please copy." Signed: S. J. O. (Aug 21, 1873; 3.3)

"Died, on August 10, 1873, at his residence in Caldwell County, Texas...REV. WILEY BLEWETT, in the 62d year of his age. He was born March 12, 1812, and baptized about the year 1834, commenced preaching about 1837, was married the first time in 1844, but lost his wife the same year, was married again in 1854. In 1869 or 1870 he removed to Texas, and in December 1870 settled in Caldwell County, where he died...." (Aug 28, 1873; 3.1)

"BRO. HARRIS MITCHEL was born October, 1793, and departed this life at his residence in Milam County, Texas August <u>1867</u>. BRO. MITCHEL married in early life, and raised a family consisting of sons and daughters, the most of whom have quit these shores. SISTER MITCHEL, who survived him, was born 1792, died a short time since...Brother and Sister MITCHEL came to Texas about twenty years since, and united with the Little River Baptist Church, and remained as such until the day of their death." Signed: A. E. Vandivere, August 15th, 1873. (Aug 28, 1873; 3.1)

J. L. FARQUHAR died at his residence May 24, 1873. He was born in North Carolina September 21, 1807. "He was early impressed about his salvation by the dying words of his father. He united with the New Salem Church, Hines County, Mississippi in September, 1833. He was ordained deacon in 1837. He was united to HULDAH WELLS December 18th, 1827. His wife died October 27, 1862. He was married the second time to MRS. DREPPE WELLS October 6, 1864. BRO. FARQUHAR and wife were in the organization of the Washington Church in March, 1841. About this time EDER TRYON began his labors as missionary of the Marion Board. Soon the Education Society was organized, from which sprang Baylor University. BRO. FARQUHAR was elected one of the first trustees, and continued until death." Signed: J. E. P. (Aug 28, 1873; 3.3)

"SINTHY HARDIN died July 18th, 1873, aged 70 years, 19 days. Was born in Ash County, North Carolina, moved to Knox County, Tennessee when young. United with the Baptist church in 1870, married Bro. G. W. HARDIN 1826, moved to Texas 1855. ...She has left a husband, six children, and numerous grandchildren...The Memphis Baptist and Knoxville papers will please copy." Signed: JOSEPH BIRD. (Aug 28, 1873; 3.3)

MRS. MARTHA F. O'BRYAN died at Bremond, Robertson County, Texas, July 9, 1873. She was the wife of J. T. O'BRYAN and the second daughter of REV. B. B. CHANDLER, of Fayette County, Texas. She was born in Greene County, Georgia, May 5, 1842, and was married March 17, 1859....She leaves a husband and four small children. (Aug 28, 1873; 3.3)

Died, at her father's house in Calvert, Texas, on the 19th inst., MISS MARY E. MARKS, aged 22 years, 2 months and 13 days.

Owensboro, Kentucky papers, and Dallas Herald, please copy. Signed: W. H. DODSON, Calvert, July 24, 1873. (Aug 28, 1873; 3.3)

WILLIE TAYLOR, grandson of Bro. J. A. FLIPPENS, died near Pilot Point on the 8th inst. He was accidentally wounded by an animal. Signed: Pastor. (Aug 28, 1873; 3.3)

In <u>Memoriam</u> to Wm. H. COLLINS, who departed this life September 7th, 1873, in the 20th year of his age. Signed: Cha's M. N. (Sept 11, 1873; 3.3)

Lines to Daisie Menard: a poem which tells of one missing from the household ("We call her dead...."). Signed: Mrs. P., Solitude, August 29th, 1873. (Sept 11, 1873; 3.3)

Tehuacana Mills, Limestone County, August 28th, 1873. "Allow me to say to my friends and brethren that my son JAMES W. MERCER died...on the 24th inst. He made a profession and joined the Baptist church at Towash two years since. Swept off like a tornado, we had no opportunity to converse with him. ...Pray for the aged father and mother." Signed: W. A. MERCER. (Sept 11, 1873; 3.3)

MINNIE FLORENCE, daughter of B. S. and H. L. FITZGERALD, died September 20th, aged 7 years and 5 months. [A poem entitled, "To Little Minnie Florence," by Chas. M. Norton, follows.] (Sept 25, 1873; 3.3)

"Died, the 1st inst., at her residence, ELIZA HEISIG, aged thirty five. Sister HEISIG was born in Paris, France; became converted when young; was baptized in London in 1858, some months after her marriage with our Bro. HEISIG...." (Sept 25, 1873; 3.3)

Died, near Hempstead, Texas, on September 10, 1873, ROBERT ROANE LACY, aged 13 years and 5 days, son of ALEXANDER and M. ALLEN LACY. (Sept 25, 1873; 3.3)

LILLY POWER, only daughter of COL. CHARLES POWER, deceased, and ANTOINNETTE POWER, died near Independence, Washington County, on the seventeenth day of August, 1873, aged 14 years and 7 months. Signed: H. C. (Oct 2, 1873; 3.3)

"Bro. JEREMIAH, son of AIKEN and ELIZABETH KILLINGSWORTH, was born in Chickasaw County, Mississippi January 10th, 1840; removed with his father to Jackson County, Texas in 1852; became a member of Eanon Baptist Church in 1858; was afterwards dismissed by letter, to join Brush Creek Church at its constitution, and was elected clerk, which office he held until he died. Was married to Miss SARAH ANN PIERCE January 6th, 1870. Died September 4th, 1873 after an illness of eighteen days. Personally Bro. KILLINGSWORTH was large, fleshy, and healthy a poor man - a farmer by occupation....He leaves a wife, two little daughters, a father, two brothers, and four sisters on these shores...." Signed: N. J. E. (Oct 16, 1873; 3.3,4)

MISS MAGGIE WARREN departed this life at Hockley, Texas September 22, 1873. [Long eulogy.] (October 16, 1873; 3.3)

MRS. NANCY MORROW, wife of ISAAC MORROW, died September 11, 1873. She was born July 17, 1821, and was married May 2, 1841. She joined the Baptist Church of Christ in 1862. Signed: J. S. MILES. (Oct 23, 1873; 3.2)

JOHNNIE, youngest son of W. B. NORSWORTHY, died at his father's residence on Buffalo Bayou, four miles below Harrisburg, on the night of the third inst., aged three years. (Oct 23, 1873; 3.3)

MISS ELIZA McDANIEL, daughter of WM. M. and ENSTALIA E. McDANIEL, died near Butler, Freestone County, on Wednesday, October 1, 1873. She was born February 16, 1855, and was age 18 years, 7 months and 14 days at the time of her death. She was baptized into the fellowship of Butler Baptist Church in the summer of 1869 by ELDER J. J. HARRIS. "When it was remarked that she [Eliza] would soon see some younger brothers who had died, 'Yes,' she said, 'and Willie too' - (a brother who had but recently died)." Signed: W. T. CHASE, Butler, Oct. 4th, 1873. (Oct 23, 1873; 3.3,4)

MRS. SACKIE I. STEELE was born October 8, 1840 at Columbus, Mississippi, daughter of READING S. BLOUNT and LOUISA LONG, of Halifax County, North Carolina - two of the oldest, wealthiest, and first families of that state, and who had been Baptists for several generations. She was married April 30, 1866 to A. L. STEELE, by Rev. J. B. LINK. Her death occurred on the 5th of October, 1873, at Toronto, Canada...."The deceased had been for several years a resident of this city [Houston]. She had gone on a summer tour, hoping to improve her health. After an absence of about two months from her home, she contracted a cold...and though nursed by husband, sister, and friends, she soon passed...." [In eulogy, the writer refers to her sister as the only surviving member of her family.] Signed: J. T. Z. (Oct 30, 1873; 3.4)

"Died, October 5th, 1873, in Travis County, Texas, JERRY QUINTAS, the infant son of J. C. and J. M. HARRIS, formerly of Virginia, aged 2 years and 7 months." Signed: H. (Oct 30, 1873; 3.4)

MRS. ALICE M. HOLT, wife of Elder A. J. HOLT, and daughter of Elder L. S. MARKHAM, died at Webberville, Travis County, Texas, September 21, 1873. Signed: A. J. H. (Oct 30, 1873; 3.4)

EDWARD E. McGAUGHEY son of J. C. and MARTHA J. McGAUGHEY, died near Montgomery, Texas September 8, 1873, aged 17 years, 4 months and 13 days. He was baptized in September, 1871, by the writer, into the fellowship of Montgomery church. Signed: R. F. HARRIS. (Oct 30, 1873; 3.4)

MRS. BETTIE J. KIMBALL, "consort of our beloved pastor, Rev. J. A. KIMBALL...departed this life October 15th, 1873, at Larissa, Cherokee County, aged 26 years....She leaves an infant boy aged 14 months." During the war she was a student at Andrews Female College, Huntsville, Texas, was graduated with honors, and after this devoted a portion of time to teaching. Signed: V. C. R. (Nov 13, 1873; 3.3,4)

BLANCHE McNEILL, wife of CHARLES P. COLLIER, died on July 25, 1873. She leaves a husband and four children. Signed: P. (Nov 13, 1873; 3.4)

WM. M. McDANIEL died at his residence near Butler, Freestone County, Texas, November 2, 1873. He was born in Clinton, Jones County, Georgia, December 7, 1822. He was baptized into the fellowship of Butler Baptist Church in August, 1873, by ELDER WM. MANNING. "Peacefully he fell asleep, and by the side of his sainted ELIZA he awaits the resurrection of the just." Mentioned: a brother-in-law. Signed: W. T. CHASE. (Nov 20, 1873; 3.3)

BEAULAH COX, daughter of DR. WM. D. and E. T. COX, died near Bethel, Anderson County, Texas, October 21, 1873, aged 5 years. "The body was laid by the side of her sainted father in the graveyard at Judson Church...." Signed: J. H. R., Tyler, Texas, November Sth, 1873. (Nov 20, 1873; 3.3)

JOHN B. HANCOCK died 21 October 1873. He was born in Jackson County, Alabama, 22 March 1826, and moved to Texas in the fall of 1848. He married MISS SARAH F. HANCOCK of Bastrop County June 1, 1851, and joined the Baptist church at Hill's Prairie in the summer of 1856. He leaves a wife and nine children. Signed: A. W. M., Hill's Prairie, Bastrop County, Texas, November 11th, 1873. (Nov 20, 1873; 3.3)

HATTIE A. FARRIOR, only daughter of Mrs. HATTIE A. FARRIOR, died at Graad Cane [Grand Cane?] in Liberty County, Texas, 4 November 1873, aged nineteen years and nine days. "She was all a mother could wish a daughter to be - her father having died when she was quite an infant, and having only one surviving brother, who was much older, whom she loved as a child loves a father. No brother ever had a sister who loved him more ardently than she loved him, and his wife she loved as a sister, and her two little nieces and nephew equally so...." Signed: A Friend, Liberty, November 21st, 1873. (Dec 4, 1873; 4.3)

"SAM ELLIS was born in Lavaca County, Texas, December 21st, 1849. He was the only son of RICHARD ELLIS and his wife, MARY MUNN. Of his father, the author of 'Flowers and Fruits from the Wilderness,' (who was his early associate and knew him well) says: 'RICHARD ELLIS preached with great power a number of years, and passed to his reward while in the prime of life.' The venerable Judge BAYLOR has often remarked that he was a worthy associate and fitting compeer in the...ministry of the lamented WM. M. TRYON. His mother is the sister of Rev. REDDIN ANDREWS, Jr. His last illness...terminated in his death, at his mother's residence in Fayette County, Texas, on...October 4th. He professed religion and was baptized into the fellowship of Shiloh Church by Rev. P. B. CHANDLER...in July 1865. His uncle, REDDIN ANDREWS, Jr., was baptized at the same time. He entered Baylor University in 1868, and with intervals of short or long duration according as his mother's business demanded, has been a student until last June." [Long eulogy, in which he is mentioned as an only son.] Signed: W. C. C. (Dec 11, 1873; 3.3)

MRS. FLORENCE A. LUMPKIN, daughter of JASPER and MARTHA McKINNEY, and wife of ELDER C. P. LUMPKIN, was born in Alabama on the 9th of August 1852, and died in Texas on the 29th of November, 1873, aged 21 years, 3 months, and 20 days. Her parents emigrated to Texas the year of her birth, and settled in Milam County. At the age of 16 she...was baptized and united...with the Little River Baptist Church. At the age of 19 she was married to Elder C. P. LUMPKIN, and afterwards moved her membership to the Port Sullivan Baptist Church, to be with her husband...." [In eulogy are mentioned: baby; father; mother; brothers; sisters; husband.] Signed: W. A. RICE, M.D. (Jan 15, 1874; 3.4)

HENRY J. GOOCH, son of A. R. and M. L. GOOCH, died near Calvert, of yellow fever, aged 26 years. He was born in Shelby County, Alabama. Signed: G. W. G., December, 1873. (Jan 15, 1874; 3.4)

"Bro. LAMBERTH HOPKINS was born in the State of Georgia September 24th, 1800; was married in the year 1824 to Miss SUSAN ADCOCK, of Alabama; joined the Methodist church in Alabama in 1832, and lived a consistent member until the day of his death, which occurred upon the 8th day of July last. Bro. HOPKINS came to Milam County, Texas in 1869...." Signed: A. E. VANDIVERE. "Texas Christian Advocate please copy." (March 5, 1874; 3.4)

"...WILLIAM MONROE FEKES was born in the State of Alabama, Bibb County, the 8th day of April 1848. He was baptized into the fellowship of the Fellowship Baptist Church in the State of Mississippi, Jasper County, in September, 1865. He emigrated to Texas, Milam County, in the year 1870. He was at the time of his death a member of the North Elm Baptist Church. This dear young brother was killed by the fall of his horse while riding him at night, which occurred on the 30th day of November last...." Signed: A. E. VANDIVERE. (March 5, 1874; 3.4)

"Died, of Meningitis, November 11th, 1873, at her father's residence in McLennan County, MATTIE HELM, daughter of P. N. HELM, in her 21st year...." Signed: B. (Dec 11, 1873; 3.2)

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### TARRANT COUNTY, TEXAS DEED RECORDS

Publication of abstracts of deed records from Book A, the earliest extant deed book in the Tarrant County Courthouse, was begun in 1972 by Betty Coburn Winchester. It is hoped that we may be able to resume publication of these records in the February, 1973, issue of "Footprints."

Although many of these records deal with conveyances during the period following the courthouse fire on the night of March 29, 1876, many are records that were re-filed, and rerecorded. Since the indexes to Tarrant County deed records do not show the date of the instrument, the oldest records must be located by turning through the deed books, page by page.

The Fort Worth Genealogical Society would welcome assistance in locating, by book and page, the oldest deeds of the county that are of record in the courthouse.

BIBLE RECORD OF THE TERRY, STANDEFER AND SHORT FAMILIES

Contributed by Mrs. Odell Starkey, Route 2, Rusk, Texas 75785

This Bible is presently owned by Mr. Wayne Short, of Rusk, who is a grandson of William R. Short and Mary Ann Laura Standefer. The relationship of the Terry family to the Short and/or Standefer family, if any, is not known. Mary Standefer, born in Virginia (census), was apparently living in Arkansas in 1838, and by July 1, 1844 was living on the East Fork of the Trinity River in old Fannin County in the Peters colony, where she had come as a widow with two children, one of whom was adopted. (Conner, Seymour V. <u>The Peters Colony of Texas</u>.) She was granted 640 acres land in Collin County prior to 1859.

John L. Terry came to the Peters Colony prior to July 1, 1848, and in 1850 was issued a certificate for 640 acres land in Collin County, which he sold unlocated (Conner). He is missing from the 1850 census of Collin County, but Ann (Felter) Terry and her five children were enumerated, the three older children said to have been born in Illinois.

#### BIBLIOPRINTS

News From The Library

By Patricia Chadwell

As was promised in the last issue, this quarter's column will consist mainly of lists of new books available in the department. The first list is made up of books which have been purchased with library funds; the second, those books which make up the Ione Adamson Nolan Memorial.

Several noteworthy occurrences need mention, however. Of primary importance is our recent rearrangement of the room, which was forced by rising numbers of thefts and mutilations. All genealogical books, and reference books in other collections, have been placed in the northern part of the room, which can be reached only by passing a staff member. Users are required to sign the register with name and full address, and to present identification showing the address. All notebooks, briefcases, and large bags will be checked before the person leaves the area.

We have obtained interlibrary loan privileges for our patrons from the Federal Records Center in Kansas City, Missouri. The center has film of the 1850 and 1880 census for the midwestern states, an area which we have never been able to cover. A list of films available has been posted on the bulletin board in the department. The states covered are: Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Dakota Territory, and Kansas. The films are lent for three weeks (which includes transit time, so that they will be available to the borrower for about two weeks), and may be used only in the library. They may be ordered through the Interlibrary Loan desk in the General Reference Department (Phone: 332-6993).

After making arrangements with the Federal Records Center in Kansas City, I called Mr. Younkin at the Fort Worth Federal Records Center to see what might be available there under the National Archives deposit program. As might be expected, a great deal of Indian material has been deposited there, but material of more general interest will be forthcoming, such as the films of the Revolutionary Pension files. He has promised to keep us supplied with lists of their holdings. The Fort Worth Public Library will not be able to borrow anything other than census records from our own center. Therefore, area genealogists will probably want to apply for permits to use the Federal Records Center.

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#### PRESIDENT'S PAGE

Don't fear complaints; they're the key to progress!

It's always a surprise to find how many Society members are upset, by complaints.

Too often these people come all "unglued" whenever a member protests some policy or procedure.

Worst of all, in our feverish desire to avoid complaints, we begin to adopt policies that are essentially negative: We won't do this any more; we won't do that any more; and in the long run we won'td do anything much.

Why this attitude toward complaints? The main reason is the feeling that the member who comes with a complaint is an enemy.

How should complaints be handled?

- 1. A member with a complaint wants to be treated like a reasonable human being. He is probably slightly embarrassed to be making a complaint; it is not an easy thing to do. You can make a friend out of him by listening courteously.
- 2. Some complaints are reasonable, and some are not. Every complaint should be treated as if it is reasonable.
- 3. When a member makes a reasonable complaint, the only reasonable response is: "Jo, I'm sorry this happened. I'm glad you told me about it. We certainly must do something about this."
- 4. When a member makes an unreasonable complaint, it may result from lack of information or from sheer crankiness. In either case a try at constructive discussion should be made. Sometimes this doesn't work, but it works often enough that it is always worth trying.

Anyone skillful in handling complaints must like people and enjoy listening to them. He or she must be calm, feeling no urge to impress people with knowledge or work. He or she must be willing to admit that things sometime go wrong and be willing to take steps to correct them. If a member is that kind of a person, he or she will find that handling complaints gives as many ideas for improving the Society as going to workshops or reading technical literature.

A member with a reasonable complaint is a valuable member.

# BETTY COBURN WINCHESTER (1932 - 1972)

The Fort Worth Genealogical Society has sustained a great loss in the death of our Editor, Betty Coburn Winchester. A member since 1965, Betty had been very active in our society, having served several terms on the Board of Directors. She was one of those who helped the society grow to its present status. Prior to becoming Editor of FOOTPRINTS in 1969, Betty had served the society as workshop speaker and co-worker on the Census Project. She had done more census-copying than any other member working on that project and had completed all of the Tarrant County censuses, as well as various tax lists. She was an authority on Tarrant County history, having done vast research from primary source records.

Betty was born January 8, 1932, in Tarrant County, Texas, a daughter of Barney and Ruth (Wells) Coburn. She grew up in her native county, and attended Amon Carter High School, North and Texas Christian University. She Texas State University, was a member of St. John The Apostle Catholic Church, where she served as church secretary and was very active in the work of her church. In past years she also had been active in such organizations as PTA, garden club, Boy Scouts, the Daughters of the Republic of Texas, and Junior Historians. Betty never sought the limelight, but was often asked to speak to various groups on history and genealogy. At St. John's school she had a group of eighth graders whom she instructed in history, genealogy, and library usage.

Betty is survived by her husband, John D. Winchester, and six children: Marian, a graduate of North Texas State University; Byron, a student at Tarrant County Junior College; Eddie, a 1972 graduate of Richland High School; Richard, an eighth grader at St. John's school; Patrick, age 9; and Catherine Ann, age 7. Other survivors include her parents, of Fort Worth, and a sister, Mrs. Peggy Gough, of Dallas.

To Betty's family we extend our deepest sympathy and, at the same time, our grateful appreciation for her work in our society. Betty has, indeed, left her "footprints on the sands of time."
