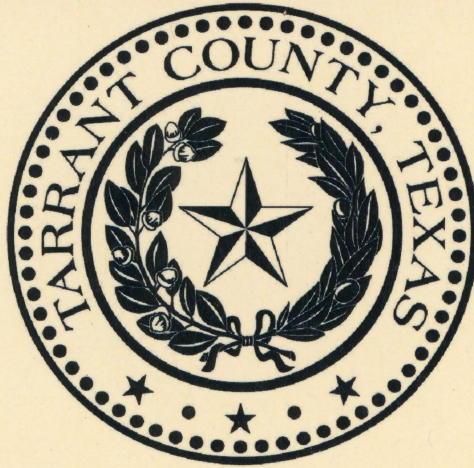

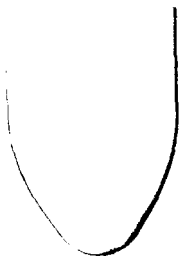

Davis, do solemnly swear that I will faithfully and impartially discharge and perform all the duties incumbent on me as Collector of Taxes according to the best of my skill and ability, agreeable to the Constitution and Laws of the United States and of this State; and I do further solemnly swear that since the adoption of the Constitution of this State, I being a citizen of this State, have not fought a duel with deadly weapons, within this State or out of it, nor have I sent or accepted a challenge to fight a duel with deadly weapons, nor have I acted as second in carrying a challenge, or aided, advised or assisted any person thus offending; and I furthermore solemnly swear that I have not, directly or indirectly, paid, offered or promised to pay, contributed nor promised to contribute any money or valuable thing, or promised any public office or employment as a reward for the giving or withholding a vote at the election at which I was elected.
So Help me God.
