Another reminder for those who haven't yet responded: the last day for the decennial Census is on Wednesday, September 30. Every ten years, all U.S. residents, regardless of citizenship status, are required to be counted. Tarrant County is working with area cities and local partners to encourage everyone, including those who live in hardto-count areas, to take part. The Census impacts federal funding, the number of Congressional seats for each state, redistricting, economic development, and quality of life. Also, remember the Census is legally bound not to share your information with other government agencies. Visit census.tarrantcounty.com for more information on how you and your family can be counted.

COVID-19 continues to be a focus and challenge during this time. The County has established a long-term testing site in Northeast Tarrant County at NRH20 in North Richland Hills. This site will serve any immediate needs for testing in our area and serve as a safeguard, providing a good volume of testing should the need increase. ## Q&A with Troy Dungan, iconic weatherman, Care N' Care member and Care N' Care spokesman

#### Q: Why is Care N' Care involved in our local communities?

A: One of the main reasons is that Medicare can be so confusing with so many options. A lot of seniors don't fully understand the coverage they need and what they don't need, so that's why we work with local senior centers and the YMCA centers associated with the Metropolitan Fort Worth YMCA and others. We want their members to be fully informed so they can make wise decisions. In that sense, we see our participation as a public service.

#### Q: You don't just show up at those centers, do you?

A: We really do get involved personally. I like to say "Hi" and hug as many seniors as I can, because I am one. Of course, that's more difficult now that we're in this pandemic, but we still do our outreach, such as our first local popsicle drive-through event recently. And we're planning to do more.

#### Q: Why is Care N' Care such a major supporter of Empowering Seniors?

A: This event is an amazing outreach for seniors, caregivers and baby boomers, and they absolutely love it. I remember two years ago when it rained hard in the morning. # **ELECTION DAY NOVEMBER 3, 2020**

**Early Voting - Joint General & Special Election** 

### October 13, 2020 to October 30, 2020

Texas enables residents to vote early in person during the prescribed early voting period to make the voting process more convenient and accessible. Generally, a Tarrant County voter can go to any of the early voting locations in an election unless specified on the Early Voting Schedule. Follow the links below:

- $\Rightarrow$  Early Voting Schedule (Available closer to the election)
- ⇒ Last Day to Register to Vote (For this election October 5, 2020)
- $\Rightarrow$  <u>View ID Requirements</u> for voting in person.

### Transportation and Assistance Programs in Northeast Tarrant County

#### for Seniors, Disabled and Low-Income

Tarrant County Commissioner Gary Fickes finds residents solutions by bringing people together. In 2009, the first Empowering Seniors event came to light as a platform for seniors to have access to essential information about services. Also, with the fast growth taking place in Northeast Tarrant County, he saw another need to fill, and in 2010 started the Northeast Tarrant Transportation Summit. He brought community leaders, business owners, and others together to keep everyone informed about transportation construction projects, and to provide an outlet for ongoing dialogue and proposed solutions for our most pressing transportation problems. Both events have served the community for the past eleven years.

What most people don't realize is for the past nine years, a significant portion of the proceeds from these two events have gone to area non-profits as a donation. These funds supplement their funding for the transportation assistance they offer area seniors, disabled residents, and help other non-profits with specialized programs for citizens in Tarrant County. All of this is possible, thanks to the wonderful sponsors, vendors, and supporters of our events while using no taxpayer dollars.
