Tarrant County Public Health **Heat-Related Illnesses and Deaths**



MMWR Week 36 (September 2 - 8, 2018)

- Other Heat-Related Illness* was the most commonly observed heat-related illness (HRI) category during the week of September 2-8, with 4 (40%) of 10 HRI cases.
- The most commonly observed HRI category for the 2018 season was Other Heat-Related Illness* with 254 (50%) of 511 HRI cases.
- *Males* account for 71% of HRIs in the 2018 season; individuals *25-44 years of age* account for the highest percentage (39%) of HRI cases.
- There have been four confirmed heat-related deaths[†] reported in the 2018 season.

Figure 1. Heat-related illnesses by type, Tarrant County, April 29 - September 8, 2018






Figure 2. Heat-related illnesses by gender and age group, Tarrant County, April 29 - Sept. 8, 2018
