Tarrant County is requesting bids for the **ANNUAL CONTRACT FOR ELECTRONIC FIRE ALARM INSPECTIONS AND REPAIRS** for the **FACILITIES MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT**. All bids must be submitted on the attached Price Forms. Tarrant County will not enter into any contract where the cost is provisional upon such clauses as "escalator" or "cost-plus" clauses.

All bids are due in the Tarrant County Purchasing Department by the due date in sealed envelopes or boxes. All bids must be clearly marked with the Bid Number, the name of the company submitting the bid, and date and time of opening on the outside of the envelope/box and/or Air Bill/Delivery Receipt. The original bid must be clearly marked "ORIGINAL" and contain all original signatures. "No-Bid" Response to be returned on the form included in the section under Forms.

Any bid received after the date and/or hour set for bid opening will not be accepted. The Bidder will be notified and will advise Tarrant County Purchasing as to the disposition by either pick up, return at Bidder's expense, or destroyed with written authorization of the Bidder. If bids are sent by mail to the Tarrant County Purchasing Department, the Bidder shall be responsible for actual delivery of the bid to the Tarrant County Purchasing Department before the advertised date and hour for opening of bids. If mail is delayed either in the postal service or in the internal mail system of Tarrant County beyond the date and hour set for the bid opening, bids thus delayed will not be considered and will be disposed of as authorized.

Bids may be withdrawn at any time prior to the official opening. Alterations made before opening time must be initialed by Bidder guaranteeing authenticity. After the official opening, bids become the property of Tarrant County and may not be amended, altered or withdrawn without the recommendation of the Tarrant County Purchasing Agent and the approval of Tarrant County Commissioners' Court.

Tarrant County is exempt from Federal Excise and State Sales Tax; therefore, tax must not be included in this bid. Tarrant County is not exempt from Surplus Lines Tax or Texas Stamping Tax.

Tarrant County reserves the right to accept or reject in part or in whole any bids submitted and to waive any technicalities for the best interest of Tarrant County.

No oral explanation or instructions will be given by Tarrant County officials or employees in regard to the meaning of the specifications before the award of the contract unless authorized by the Tarrant County Purchasing Agent or their designee. Requests from interested bidders for additional information or interpretation of the information included in the specifications should be directed in writing, via fax or via email, to:

No documents will be faxed or emailed after the initial Notice of Intent prior to award. It is the Bidder's sole responsibility to review this site and retrieve all related documents up to the RFB due date.

**Emailed Questions**: The email **must** include the RFB No. in its subject and confirmation of receipt by Tarrant County is **required**.

All bids shall specify terms and conditions of payment, which will be considered as part of, but not control, the award of bid. County review, inspection, and processing procedures ordinarily require thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice, materials, or service. Bids which call for payment before thirty (30) days from receipt of invoice, or cash discounts given on such payment, will be considered only if, in the opinion of the Tarrant County Purchasing Agent, the review, inspection, and processing procedures can be completed as specified.

<u>Invoices</u> shall be sent directly to the Tarrant County Auditor's Office, Attention: Accounts Payable, 100 East Weatherford, Room 506, Fort Worth, Texas 76196, or email to <u>SAP-invoices@tarrantcounty.com</u>. In accordance with the Prompt Payment Act, it is the intention of Tarrant County to make payment on completed orders within thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice or items; whichever is later, unless unusual circumstances arise. **Invoices must be fully documented as to labor, materials, and equipment provided and must reference the Tarrant County Purchase Order Number in order to be processed. No payments shall be made on invoices not listing a Purchase Order Number.** 

<u>Continuing non-performance</u> of the Vendor in terms of Specifications shall be a basis for the termination of the contract by Tarrant County. Tarrant County shall not pay for work, equipment, or supplies which are unsatisfactory. The Vendor will be given a reasonable opportunity before termination to correct the deficiencies. This, however, shall in no way be construed as negating the basis for termination for non-performance.

The <u>contract may be terminated</u> by either party upon written thirty (30) day notice prior to cancellation.

Bids will be considered non-responsive if they show any omissions, alteration of form, additions or conditions not called for, or inconsistencies of any kind. However, Tarrant County reserves the right to waive any inconsistencies and to make an award in the best interest of Tarrant County.

Bids may be rejected, among other reasons, for any of the following specific reasons:

- Bids containing any inconsistencies.
- 2. Unbalanced value of any items.

Bidders may be disqualified and their bids not considered, among other reasons, for any of the following specific reasons:

- 1. Reason for believing collusion exists among the Bidders.
- 2. Reasonable grounds for believing that any Bidder is interested in more than one (1) Bid for the work contemplated.
- 3. Bidder being interested in any litigation against Tarrant County.
- 4. Bidder being in arrears on any existing contract or having defaulted on a previous contract.
- 5. Lack of competency as revealed, including but not limited to, by a financial statement, experience and equipment and questionnaires.
- 6. Uncompleted work, which in the judgment of Tarrant County, will prevent or hinder the prompt completion of additional work, if awarded.
- Bidders shall not owe delinquent property tax in Tarrant County.
- 8. Limited competition.

It is the Bidders' sole responsibility to print and review all pages of the bid document, attachments, questions and responses, addenda and special notices. The Signature Form must be signed and returned. Failure to provide a signature on the form renders bid non-responsive. Failure to complete and submit all required forms, including but not limited to References, Compliance With Federal and State Laws Form, Questionnaires (when applicable), Addenda (including revised forms), and any other specified forms or documents will be grounds for rejection of the entire bid.

CONFIDENTIALITY: Any material that is to be considered confidential must be clearly marked as such and shall be treated as confidential to the extent allowable under Section 552.136, Texas Government Code. Notice will be sent to you pursuant to Section 552.305 of the Texas Government Code should Tarrant County receive an open records request to inspect your bid. This notice will allow you to assert any objections to the release of confidential information in response to an open records request. It is your responsibility to assert any objections to the release of your bid in response to an open records request. Tarrant County cannot argue on your behalf that the information contained in your bid is exempt from public release. Trade secrets or confidential information MUST be placed in a separate envelope marked "CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION." Note: PRICING INFORMATION IS NOT CONSIDERED CONFIDENTIAL AND IF MARKED AS SUCH, WILL RESULT IN REJECTION OF YOUR BID.

Due care and diligence have been used in the preparation of this information, and it is believed to be substantially correct. However, the responsibility for determining the full extent of the exposure and the verification of all information presented herein shall rest solely with the Bidder. Tarrant County and its representatives will not be responsible for any errors or omissions in these specifications, nor for the failure on the part of the Bidder to determine the full extent of the exposures.

Vendor may not assign their rights and duties under an award without the written consent of the Tarrant County Purchasing Agent. Such consent shall not relieve the assignor of liability in the event of default by the assignee.

TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, VENDOR AGREES TO DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD TARRANT COUNTY, ITS OFFICIALS, AGENTS, SERVANTS, AND EMPLOYEES, HARMLESS AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, LAWSUITS, ACTIONS, COSTS AND EXPENSES OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THOSE FOR PROPERTY DAMAGE OR LOSS (INCLUDING ALLEGED DAMAGE OR LOSS TO OWNER'S BUSINESS AND ANY RESULTING LOST PROFITS), EMPLOYMENT MATTERS, AND/OR PERSONAL INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, THAT MAY RELATE TO OR ARISE OUT OF OR BE OCCASIONED BY (I) VENDOR'S BREACH OF ANY OF THE TERMS OF PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT OR (II) ANY NEGLIGENT ACT OR OMISSION OR INTENTIONAL MISCONDUCT OF VENDORS, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS, ASSOCIATES, EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS OR SUBCONTRACTORS, RELATED TO THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT.

VENDOR(S) WILL COMPLY WITH ALL STATE, FEDERAL, AND LOCAL LAWS INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, TITLE VII OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS OF 1964, AGE DISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT ACT, CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1991, FEDERAL INSURANCE CONTRIBUTIONS ACT (FICA), FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT, EQUAL PAY ACT OF 1963 AND THE AFFORDABLE HEALTH CARE ACT, AS TO TREATMENT AND COMPENSATION OF ITS EMPLOYEES.

Hours of operation shall be between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Delivery date is important to Tarrant County and may be part of the bid and a factor in evaluation of each bid. Tarrant County considers delivery time to be that period elapsing from the time the individual order is placed until that order is received by Tarrant County at the specified delivery location. The delivery date indicates a guaranteed delivery to Tarrant County, Texas. Failure of the Vendor to meet guaranteed delivery dates or service performance could affect future Tarrant County orders.

Tarrant County reserves the right to demand bond or penalty to guarantee delivery by the date indicated. If the order is given and the Vendor fails to furnish the materials by the guaranteed date, Tarrant County reserves the right to cancel the order without liability on its part.

A <u>packing list</u> must accompany each shipment and must include but is not limited, to the following:

- 1. Tarrant County Purchase Order Number
- 2. Name and address of Vendor
- 3. Name and address of receiving department
- 4. Description of material shipped, including item numbers, quantity, etc.

#### SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

- 1. <u>CONTRACT TERMS</u>: Vendor(s) will be awarded a twelve (12) month contract, effective from the date of award or notice to proceed as determined by the Tarrant County Purchasing Department. At Tarrant County's option and approval by the Vendor, the contract may be renewed for two (2) additional twelve (12) month periods, as further explained in Renewal Options. **Prices must remain firm for the entire contract.**
- 2. RENEWAL OPTIONS: Tarrant County reserves the right to exercise an option to renew the contract of the Vendor for two (2) additional twelve (12) month periods, provided such option is stipulated and agreed upon by both parties. If Tarrant County exercises the right in writing, the Vendor must update and submit any documents required during the initial solicitation by no later than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the commencement of the option period. Required documents must be in force for the full period of the option. If the updated documents are not submitted by the Vendor in complete form within the time specified, Tarrant County may rescind its option or seek a new solicitation.
- 3. <u>SECONDARY/ALTERNATE AWARD</u>: Secondary or Alternate Vendors serve in a backup capacity only. In the event the Primary is unable to honor the terms and conditions of the contract, the Secondary Vendor(s) may be called. If the Secondary Vendor is unable to honor the terms and conditions of the contract the Alternate Vendor(s) may be called. The Primary Vendor is the first contact. Use of the Secondary or Alternate Vendor(s) must be approved, in writing, by the Tarrant County Purchasing Agent or his designee in compliance with Texas Local Government Code 262.027(g).
  - A. In the event the Secondary or Alternate Vendors are called upon, they will offer the materials and services at their awarded price(s), or better. Any attempt to increase their awarded price(s) may cause the removal of the Vendor from the contract. Calling upon the Secondary or Alternate Vendors does not necessarily affect the status of any awarded Vendor, including the Primary Vendor.
  - B. If a Secondary or Alternate Vendor represents themselves as the Primary Vendor without written authorization from the Tarrant County Purchasing Agent, or his designee, the Secondary or Alternate Vendor may be removed from the contract.

#### SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

#### 5. <u>MINIMUM INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS</u>:

- A. Vendor shall take out, pay for and maintain at all times during the prosecution of the work under the contract, the following forms of insurance, in carriers acceptable to and <u>approved by</u> Tarrant County.
  - 1) Workers' Compensation/Employer's Liability
    - a. Worker's Compensation statutory
    - b. Employer's Liability \$500,000
  - 2) Commercial General Liability:
    - a. Bodily Injury/Personal Injury/Property Damage \$1,000,000 per occurrence/\$2,000,000 aggregate
  - 3) Auto Liability:
    - a. Combined Single Limit (CSL) \$500,000 per occurrence
- B. Tarrant County reserves the right to review the insurance requirements of this section during the effective period of the contract and to require adjustment of insurance coverage and their limits when deemed necessary and prudent by Tarrant County based upon changes in statutory law, court decisions, or the claims history of the industry as well as the Vendor.
- C. Required Provisions:
  - 1) Proof of Carriage of Insurance All Certificates of Insurance will be required in duplicate and filed with the Tarrant County Purchasing Agent and the Budget and Risk Management Department at 100 East Weatherford Street, Suite 305, Fort Worth, Texas 76196 prior to work commencing.
  - 2) All Certificates shall provide Tarrant County with an unconditional thirty (30) days written notice in case of cancellation or any major change.
  - 3) As to all applicable coverage, policies shall name Tarrant County and its officers, employees, and elected representatives as an additional insured.
  - 4) All copies of the Certificates of Insurance shall reference the project name and solicitation number for which the insurance is being supplied.
  - Vendor agrees to waive subrogation against Tarrant County, its officers, employees, and elected representatives for injuries, including death, property damage, or any other loss to the extent the loss, if any, is covered by the proceeds of insurance.
  - 6) If applicable, the Vendor is responsible for making sure any subcontractor(s) performing work under this agreement has the required insurance coverage(s) and supplies Tarrant County with the proper documents verifying the coverage.

#### SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

#### 6. CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK:

- A. If this contract requires that Vendor personnel access Tarrant County Data (either on-site or remotely) or access secure areas of Tarrant County Facilities, then Vendor personnel may be required to undergo a fingerprint-based Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Background Check, a Human Resources Criminal Background Check, or a Sheriff's Criminal Background Check. Criminal Background Checks will be paid for by Tarrant County.
  - The Vendor must provide information, including, but not limited to, employee name, date of birth, a clear copy of employee's driver's license, and a copy of employee's social security card for each individual required to pass a Criminal Background Check.
  - 2. Award of a contract could be affected by the Vendor's refusal to agree to these terms.
  - Failure of the Vendor to supply personnel who pass a Criminal Background Check could affect the award of the contract or could result in the termination of the contract.
  - 4. The Criminal Background Check applies to the individual and not the Company.
  - 5. Passing status must be maintained by Vendor personnel for duration of the contract.
- 7. EXAMINATION OF EXISTING PREMISES: It is understood and agreed that the Contractor has by careful examination, satisfied himself as to the nature and location of the work, the character and quality of the materials to be encountered, the character of equipment and facilities needed preliminary to and during the prosecution of the work, the general and local conditions, and all other matters which can in any way affect the work under this contract. No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer, agent, or employee of the Owner, either before or after the execution of this contract, shall affect or modify any of the terms or obligations herein contained. The bid shall be based on the specifications, supplemented by the affecting conditions.
- 8. **RISK:** The work under this contract in every respect shall be at the risk of the Contractor until finished and accepted.
- 9. EXECUTION, CORRECTION, AND INTENT OF DOCUMENTS: The intent of the contract documents, plans and specifications is to describe the complete work to be performed under such contract. Unless otherwise provided, it is also the intent of the plans and specifications and contract documents that the respective Contractors(s) shall furnish all materials, supplies, tools, equipment, machinery, labor and supervision necessary for the prosecution and completion of the work in full compliance with the proposal, plans, specification and other documents.
- **10. LABOR**: Perform labor in a workmanlike manner by skilled mechanics of their respective trades.

#### SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

- 11. <u>WORKMEN'S SAFETY</u>: The Contractor shall meet all safety and health regulations required by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, Department of Labor and all state regulations dealing with occupational safety.
- **SALES TAX:** Contracts or subcontracts let on this project are exempt from the "Limited Sales Tax" of the State of Texas, and no provisions should be made in any bid for an amount to be used to pay such tax, either directly or indirectly.
- **MATERIAL SUBSTITUTION:** No substitution replacement equipment can be used except with prior written approval by Facilities Management and Purchasing. Equipment will be priced in line with current contract prices.
- 14. <u>CODE REQUIREMENTS</u>: The rules and regulations, ordinances and laws governing the installation of the work and/or equipment shall be in accordance with all regulations and codes of the Federal, State, and Municipal departments having jurisdiction, the National Board of Fire Underwriters, Factory Mutual Insurance, and Texas Engineering and Fire Prevention Bureau, and the local utility companies which are in force at the time of the execution of the work.
- **PROTECTION:** The Contractor shall provide and maintain all protections required by the governing laws, regulations, and ordinances. The Contractor shall be responsible for any loss or damage caused by him or his workmen to the property of the Owner or to the work or materials installed and shall make good any loss, damage, or injury without cost to the owner.
- 16. <a href="INDEMNIFICATION">INDEMNIFICATION</a>: The Contractor agrees to fully indemnify and save whole and harmless the County of Tarrant from all costs or damages arising out of any real or asserted claim or cause of action against it of whatsoever kind or character and in addition, from any and all costs or damages arising out of any wrongs, injuries, demands or suits for damages, either real or asserted, claimed against it that may be occasioned by any act, omission, neglect or misconduct of the said Contractor, his agents, servants, and employees.

#### 17. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY HOSTED OR CLOUD SOLUTION:

- A. The following is only applicable when Vendor is providing Information Technology hosted or cloud solution:
  - Confidentiality, Integrity, Availability (CIA)
     Vendor shall protect the Confidentiality, Integrity, and Availability (CIA) of all Tarrant County Data ensuring extra levels of security. All Tarrant County information must remain private and permit redaction of protected information before publication. Audit trails cannot be altered.

#### SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

#### 2. **Breach Notification**

Vendor agrees that upon discovery of unauthorized access to Tarrant County Data, Vendor shall notify Tarrant County both orally and in writing. In no event shall the notification be made more than forty-eight (48) hours after Vendor knows or reasonably suspect unauthorized access has or may have occurred. In the event of a suspected unauthorized Access, Vendor agrees to reasonably coordinate with Tarrant County to investigate the occurrence.

#### Data

All Tarrant County data will remain in the 48 contiguous United States at all times.

#### 4. Right to Audit

Tarrant County reserves the right to audit vendor data centers which house Tarrant County Data or receive SSAE 16 SOC Type II audits from a reputable security advisory service firm (e.g. EY, Deloitte, KPMG, PWC, Coalfire, etc.).

# TWCC Rule 110.110 Workers' Compensation Insurance Coverage

#### A. Definitions:

<u>Certificate of coverage ("certificate")</u> – A copy of a certificate of insurance, a certificate of authority to self-insure issued by the commission, or a coverage agreement (TWCC-81, TWCC-82, TWCC-83, or TWCC-84), showing statutory workers' compensation insurance coverage for the person's or entity's employees providing services on a project, for the duration of the project.

<u>Duration of the project</u> – Includes the time from the beginning of the work on the project until the contractor's/person's work on the project has been completed and accepted by the governmental entity.

Persons providing services on the project ("subcontractor" in §406.096) – Includes all persons or entities performing all or part of the services the contractor has undertaken to perform on the project, regardless of whether that person contracted directly with the contractor and regardless of whether that person has employees. This includes, without limitation, independent contractors, subcontractors, leasing companies, motor carriers, owner-operators, employees of any such entity, or employees of any entity which furnishes persons to provide services on the project. "Services" include, without limitation, providing, hauling or delivering equipment or materials, or providing labor, transportation, or other service related to a project. "Services" does not include activities unrelated to the project, such as food/beverage vendors, office supply deliveries, and delivery of portable toilets.

- B. The contractor shall provide coverage, based on proper reporting of classification code and payroll amounts and filing of any coverage agreements, which meets the statutory requirements of Texas Labor Code, Section 401.011(44) for all employees of the contractor providing services on the project, for the duration of the project.
- C. The contractor must provide a certificate of coverage to the governmental entity prior to being awarded the contract.
- D. If the coverage period shown on the contractor's current certificate of coverage ends during the duration of the project, the contractor must, prior to the end of the coverage period, file a new certificate of coverage with the governmental entity showing that coverage has been extended.

# TWCC Rule 110.110 Workers' Compensation Insurance Coverage

- E. The contractor shall obtain from each person providing services on a project, and provide to the governmental entity:
  - (1) a certificate of coverage, prior to that person beginning work on the project, so the governmental entity will have on file certificates of coverage showing coverage for all persons providing services on the project; and
  - (2) no later than seven (7) days after receipt by the contractor, a new certificate of coverage showing extension of coverage, if the coverage period shown on the current certificate ends during the duration of the project.
- F. The contractor shall retain all required certificates of coverage for the duration of the project and for one (1) year thereafter.
- G. The contractor shall notify the governmental entity in writing by certified mail or personal delivery, within ten (10) days after the contractor knew or should have known, of any change that materially affects the provision of coverage of any person providing services on the project.
- H. The contractor shall post on each project site a notice, in the text, form and manner prescribed by the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission, informing all persons providing services on the project that they are required to be covered, and stating how a person may verify coverage and report lack of coverage.
- I. The contractor shall contractually require each person with whom it contracts to provide services on a project to:
  - (1) provide coverage, based on reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts and filing of any coverage agreements, which meets the statutory requirements of Texas Labor Code, Section 401.011(44) for all of its employees providing services on the project for the duration of the project;
  - (2) provide to the contractor, prior to that person beginning work on the project, a certificate of coverage showing that coverage is being provided for all employees of the person providing services on the project, for the duration of the project;
  - (3) provide the contractor, prior to the end of the coverage period, a new certificate of coverage showing extension of coverage, if the coverage period shown on the current certificate of coverage ends during the duration of the project;
  - (4) obtain from each person with whom it contracts, and provide to the contractor:
    - (a) a certificate of coverage, prior to the other person beginning work on the project; and
    - (b) a new certificate of coverage showing the extension of coverage, prior to the end of the coverage period, if the coverage period shown on the current certificate ends during the duration of the project;

- (5) retain all required certificates of coverage on file for the duration of the project and for one (1) year thereafter;
- (6) notify the governmental entity in writing by certified mail or personal delivery, within ten (10) days after the person knew or should have known, of any change that materially affects the provision of coverage of any person providing services on the project; and
- (7) contractually require each person with whom it contracts, to perform as required by paragraphs (1) (7). with the certificates of coverage to be provided to the person for whom they are providing services.
- J. By signing this contract or providing or causing to be provided a certificate of coverage, the contractor is representing to the governmental entity that all employees of the contractor who will provide services on the project will be covered by workers' compensation coverage for the duration of the project, that the coverage will be based on proper reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts, and that all coverage agreements will be filed with the appropriate insurance carrier or, in the case of a self-insured, with the commission's Division of Self-Insurance Regulation. Providing false or misleading information may subject the contractor to administrative penalties, criminal penalties, civil penalties, or other civil actions.
- K. The contractor's failure to comply with any of these provisions is a breach of contract by the contractor which entitles the governmental entity to declare the contract void if the contractor does not remedy the breach within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of breach from the governmental entity.

**Evaluation criteria** shall include, but is not limited to the following:

- 1. Rate per hour and percentage (%) markup on parts, prices per building, alarm inspections, etc.
- 2. Vendor's past performance record with Tarrant County
- 3. Tarrant County's evaluation of vendor's ability to perform
- 4. Tarrant County's experience with parts and services bid
- 5. Special needs and requirements of Tarrant County
- 6. Results of Tarrant County's review/checkout of each Bidders' credentials
- 7. Bidder's staff, size, experience
- 8. Results of Tarrant County's check of vendor's references
- 9. Response Time
- 10. Vendor's agreement to extend pricing under this contract to other governmental entities located within counties in close proximity to Tarrant County.

**Quantities** indicated on the Price Forms are estimates based upon the best available information. Tarrant County reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantities to meet its actual needs without any adjustments in the bid price.

Any <u>catalog</u>, <u>brand name or manufacturer's reference</u> used is considered to be descriptive - not restrictive -- and is indicative of the type and quality Tarrant County desires to purchase. Bids on similar items of like quality may be considered if the bid is noted and fully descriptive brochures are enclosed. If notation of substitution is not made, it is assumed Vendor is bidding item specified. Vendor will not be allowed to make unauthorized substitutions after award.

#### **TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS**

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- A. Tarrant County is seeking vendors to bid on an annual agreement to inspect, repair, install, and replace fire alarms throughout Tarrant County under Codes NFPA 25 and NFPA 72.
- B. The successful vendor will be required to coordinate with the awarded fire sprinkler vendor for inspection purposes.
- C. Tarrant County intends to award to one (1) primary, secondary, and alternate vendor. The awards will be based on lowest overall bids that meet or exceed specifications.

#### 2. SCOPE

- Α. The successful vendor(s) will provide all labor and material to repair, install, replace, and complete inspections of Tarrant County owned Electronic Fire Alarm Systems. This inspection is to include all devices including smoke detectors, duct detectors, heat detectors, tamper switches, pull stations, flow switches, horns, strobes. fire-doors, batteries, and all other related devices, one (1) re-inspection of devices that originally failed after repairs are completed. Attachment A includes an inventory list for all Tarrant County alarm devices included in this bid. Vendor is to remove all light fixtures to gain access to detectors.
- B. Tarrant County reserves the right to solicit separate bids for all individual Fire Alarm System projects that may exceed \$25,000, but not limited to. Tarrant County reserves the right to use other vendors when the response time is not met, the quality of work is seen as unacceptable, the number of hours estimated/being charged is considered excessive, or the number of journeymen and/or helpers required/set to perform the work required on a certain project is determined to be excessive.
- C. Should a particular project require the County's Contractor to pull a permit from the city having jurisdiction, the contractor shall apply for and secure such permit prior to the start of work on the project requiring the permit. In no case will the contractor submit an invoice for work completed when a permit was required for that particular project and the permit was not first obtained by the contractor.

#### 3. REQUIREMENTS

#### A. LICENSE & CERTIFICATION

 Each vendor must provide with its bid a copy of the following documents, which are issued by the State of Texas Fire Marshall's Office to perform Fire Alarm Service:

- a. <u>Fire Alarm Certificate of Registration (ACR)</u> Each firm engaged in the business of fire detection devices or systems must have an ACR. The extent of work, allowed by the firm (planning, certifying, leasing, selling, servicing, installing, monitoring, or maintaining fire detection devices or systems), is limited by the license held by their employee.
- <u>Fire Alarm Branch Office Certificate of Registration</u> Each separate
  office location performing the same business as the firm holding the
  ACR must have a branch office certificate of registration.
- c. <u>Alarm Certificate of Registration Single Station (ACR-SS)</u> Each firm engaged in the business of planning, certifying, leasing, selling, servicing, installing, monitoring, or maintaining exclusively single station devices, must have an ACR-SS.
- d. <u>Fire Alarm Technicians License for each Lead Technician on the Jobsite</u> A registered firm that employs a licensed Fire Alarm Technician is permitted to sell, install, certify, service, and monitor all types of fire alarm or detection devices or systems.

#### B. INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Fire alarm systems shall be inspected completely one (1) time annually, including pre-action systems.
- The vendor shall supply one (1) re-inspection after any required repairs are completed, per original inspection documentation and then green tags issued.
- 3. Inspections will be completed up to thirty (30) days before the given date, without exception.
- Inspections will be completed and given a green/blue tag before contractor is released to leave. If any issue is found with the unit, the vendor is expected to make the repairs necessary to pass inspection. <u>VENDOR WILL NOT LEAVE ANY ALARM PANELS WITH A RED TAG AT ANY TIME</u>. Once the inspections have started, the vendor will be expected to continue work until the inspections are completed. They should not be called away to attend another.
- Vendors must adhere to the response times submitted on the Price Form.
   Repeated no shows and/or delays of scheduled work to be completed may result in termination of the contract.
- 6. It is the vendor's sole responsibility to verify all system counts/quantities and actual conditions of each building or system.
- 7. All employees conducting inspections or repairs at secured locations must submit to and pass a background check conducted by the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office. No exceptions.
- 8. Awarded vendor(s) will be required to make themselves present for fire alarm inspections when requested.

- 9. Tarrant County reserves the right to add or delete locations, services, and inventory as needed. The County will request a written quotation from the contractor for additional locations. Contractor shall submit, in writing, a fair and reasonable price based on current bid prices contained in this contract. If it is determined the quote is excessive, the County reserves the right to request quotations from additional sources.
- 10. Tarrant County reserves the right to cancel a building from service if they no longer need the service. Tarrant County Facilities Management will notify the Purchasing Agent if they are desiring to drop a building from service. The Purchasing Agent will notify the contracted vendor of this, and vendor will acknowledge, in writing, that they have received this request.
- 11. If Tarrant County had already paid for this service, Vendor will pro-rate this service and refund the difference by issuing a credit memorandum. The credit memorandum will become effective immediately when the request is sent by the Purchasing Agent.
- 12. Awarded vendors shall contact the appropriate Tarrant County Facilities Management personnel and sign-in before work is started and sign-out when work is completed. When completing services during non-working hours, awarded vendors are to make arrangements with Facilities Management personnel to check in before services begin and check out when service is completed.
- 13. Awarded vendors must schedule service dates with Tarrant County Facilities Management personnel. Vendor must not complete work without prior approval to proceed from Tarrant County Facilities Management. Changes in schedule for any reason (including inclement weather) must be approved by Tarrant County Facilities Management.
- Awarded vendor will be required to work with proprietary software vendor where necessary.
- 15. Inspections are to include inspection of batteries and replacements as necessary.
- 16. A factory trained licensed technician must always be on-site and at no time should a helper be left alone for any inspections or repairs.

#### C. VENDOR REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The Bidder must be state licensed and in the fire alarm industry for a minimum of five (5) years and lead technicians hold a minimum of three (3) years.
- 2. The Bidder must maintain an adequate number of employees to complete services required in a timely manner. All service, regular and special, must be rendered at such times and in such a manner that minimum interference with the normal facility operating agenda, will result.

#### 4. INVOICING

- A. All invoices are to be sent to the Tarrant County Facilities Management Office at <a href="mailto:tree="ma
- B. Tarrant County reserves the right to request supporting documents for typical truck stock items, as necessary. If there are questions or discrepancies about an invoice or some other document that has been submitted with invoice, vendor will be contacted by a member of the Facilities Management Staff.
- C. Priority must be given to correcting invoices, or providing the additional information, when contacted by Facilities Management Staff in a timely manner or within one (1) or two (2) days after a request has been made by Facilities Management Staff.
- D. All invoices must be dated for the same month the invoice is being submitted. All invoices must specify date of service and be accompanied by a work order or job ticket. Tarrant County Facilities Management will not sign work order or job tickets; thereby unknowingly agreeing to any other terms and conditions that may be listed on their sign-in sheets.
- E. Vendor shall not charge Tarrant County a separate "trip charge" on any project performed under this Annual Contract. Vendor's time shall not start until such time as the vendor has arrived on-site to start the project. Trip charges include trips to retrieve any necessary equipment or parts to perform the work.
- F. Vendor shall not charge fuel surcharges.
- G. Bidder shall not charge any percentage (%) mark-up on any owned or rental equipment the Bidder may rent and utilize under this contract, including Bidder's sub-contractor(s), if applicable.
- H. The County will not reimburse for parking expenses. There is limited vendor parking available on a first come first service basis offered by the County.
- I. Fees for rental equipment rented by the Vendor to carry out labor must be approved by the Facilities Manager before issuance of a Purchase Order. If the Vendor does not own equipment needed to complete the project, an invoice must be provided from the rental agency along with the quotation.

#### 5. PROPRIETARY RIGHTS AND MANUFACTURER WARRANTY

- A. When a system is under manufacturer warranty Tarrant County will only allow repairs to be made by the manufacturer, or approved representative; thus maintaining all warranty requirements. Keeping in accordance with the warranty, inspections may be conducted but no repairs of these systems can be made.
- B. Warranty Equipment will require original equipment manufacturer (OEM) parts only.

#### 6. INVENTORY LIST

- A. A Fire Alarm Systems Inventory is reflected in Attachment A.
- B. A Fire Sprinkler Systems Inventory is reflected in Attachment B.
- C. An Inspection Information List is reflected in Attachment C.

#### 7. BUILDING LIST

A. A Building List is reflected in Attachment D.

#### 8. LAYOUT ILLUSTRATION

A. A layout illustration of 350 W. Belknap Building Basement is reflected in Attachment E.

#### 9. RISKS

- A. The work under this contract in every respect must be at the risk of the Vendor until finished and accepted.
- B. Vendors must be responsible for replacing, at no cost to Tarrant County, any damaged incurred during completing of services under this request for bid.

#### 10. WORKMEN'S SAFETY

A. The Bidder must meet all safety and health regulations required by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, Department of Labor, and all state regulations dealing with occupational safety.

#### 11. PROTECTION

A. The Vendor must provide and maintain all protections required by the governing laws, regulations, and ordinances. The Vendor must be responsible for any loss or damages caused by him or his workmen to property of the Owner or to the work or materials installed and must make good any loss, damage, or injury without cost to Owner.

#### 12. SUBCONTRACTING

- A. The intent of this contract is to award to vendor(s) who will be performing most of the scope of work with their own hired staff. There may be, on occasion, some portion of the work that will require the need to hire a sub-contractor to perform a portion of the work.
- B. Should sub-contracting be required, the vendor must first obtain approval of Owner prior to any work being performed by a sub-contractor.

#### 13. ADDITIONAL CHARGES

- A. All travel costs are to be included in hourly labor rates. Bidder shall not charge Tarrant County a separate "Trip Charge", "Truck Charge", or "Service Call" on any project performed under this Annual Contract. Bidder's time shall not start until the vendor has arrived onsite to start the project.
- B. No minimum charges per trip are acceptable.
- C. No mark-ups are acceptable for rentals and freight charges.

# HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES (HUB) POLICY

#### I. POLICY STATEMENT

The Tarrant County Commissioners Court, being the policy development and budgetary control unit of county government, will strive to ensure that all businesses, regardless of size, economic, social or ethnic status have an equal opportunity to participate in the County's procurement processes. The County is committed to promote full and equal business opportunity for all businesses to supply the goods and services needed to support the mission and operations of county government, and seeks to encourage the use of certified historically underutilized businesses (HUBs) through the use of race, ethnic and gender neutral means. It is the policy of Tarrant County to involve certified HUBs to the greatest extent feasible in the County's procurement of goods, equipment, services and construction projects while maintaining competition and quality of work standards. The County affirms the good faith efforts of firms who recognize and practice similar business standards.

#### II. DEFINITIONS

<u>Historically underutilized businesses (HUBs)</u>, also known as a disadvantaged business enterprise (DBE), are generally business enterprises at least 51% of which is owned and the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more persons who is/are socially and economically disadvantaged because of his or her identification as a member of certain groups, including women, Black Americans, Mexican Americans and other Americans of Hispanic origin, Asian Americans and American Indians.

<u>Certified HUBs</u> includes business enterprises that meet the definition of a HUB and who meet the certification requirements of certification agencies recognized by Tarrant County.

<u>Businesses</u> include firms, corporations, sole proprietorships, vendors, suppliers, contractors, subcontractors, professionals and other similar references when referring to a business that provides goods and/or services regardless of the commodity category.

<u>Statutory bid limit</u> refers to the Texas Local Government Code provision that requires competitive bidding for many items valued at greater than \$50,000.

#### III. POLICY GUIDELINES

- A. Tarrant County, its contractors, their subcontractors and suppliers, as well as all vendors of goods, equipment and services, shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, gender, age, religion, national origin, citizenship, mental or physical disability, veteran's status or political affiliation in the award and/or performance of contracts. All entities doing business or anticipating doing business with the County shall support, encourage and implement affirmative steps toward a common goal of establishing equal opportunity for all citizens and businesses of the county.
- B. Tarrant County will use and recognize the State of Texas certification process in conjunction with the implementation of this policy. The County does recognize other agencies' certifications. Tarrant County reserves the right to review the certification status of any vendor applying to do business with the County. This review will be accomplished to determine the validity and authenticity of the vendor's certification as a HUB.
- C. The Commissioners Court may establish HUB target goals. Through a systematic approach of soliciting quotes, bids and proposals from certified HUBs and in compliance with applicable state and federal law this policy will strive to meet those goals.
  - 1. Target goals should consider:
    - the availability of HUB firms within the specific category of goods or services to be procured; and
    - the diversity of the county's population.
  - 2. The goals should be reviewed and amended periodically.
  - 3. The program may apply to all County procurements including construction and professional services.
  - 4. Particular attention will be given to HUB participation on purchases in excess of the statutory bid limit.
  - 5. The Commissioners Court herein establishes a 20% good faith target goal for Tarrant County.

- D. Tarrant County will actively seek and encourage HUBs to participate in all facets of the procurement process by:
  - Continuing to increase and monitor a database of certified HUB vendors, professionals and contractors. The database will be expanded to include products, areas of expertise and capabilities of each HUB firm.
  - Continuing to seek new communication links with HUB vendors, professionals and contactors to involve them in the procurement process.
  - Continuing to advertise bids on the County's website and in newspapers including newspapers that target socially and economically disadvantaged communities.
  - Continuing to provide bid notifications to minority Chambers of Commerce.
- E. As prescribed by law, the purchase of one or more items costing in excess of the statutory bid limit must comply with the competitive bid process. Where possible, those bids will be structured to include and encourage the participation of HUB firms in the procurement process by:
  - 1. Division of proposed requisitions into reasonable lots in keeping with industry standards and competitive bid requirements.
  - Where feasible, assessment of bond and insurance requirements and the designing of such requirements to reasonably permit more than one business to perform the work.
  - 3. Specification of reasonable, realistic delivery schedules consistent with the County's actual requirements.
  - 4. Specifications, terms and conditions reflecting the County's actual requirements are clearly stated, and do not impose unreasonable or unnecessary contract requirements.
- F. A HUB Policy statement shall be included in all specifications. The County will consider the bidder's responsiveness to the HUB Policy in the evaluation of bids and proposals. Failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to comply with the County's HUB policy may result in a bid or proposal being considered non-responsive to specifications.
- G. The Tarrant County Purchasing Department will actively seek the participation of HUB firms in the quotation process for purchases under the statutory bid limit. HUB firms will be identified on the computerized database and linked to the commodities they represent. Buyers will be encouraged to use available internal and external databases of certified HUB firms.

H. Nothing in this policy shall be construed to require the County to award a contract other than to the lowest responsive bidder meeting specifications as required by law. This policy is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law.

#### IV. ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES

- A. The Tarrant County Purchasing Department shall serve as the County's HUB Office with responsibility for the implementation, monitoring and general operations of the HUB policy. The Purchasing Agent shall serve as the County HUB Officer.
  - 1. The HUB Officer will establish procedures to implement this policy across the full spectrum of the procurement process. The County HUB Office will periodically review with department head and elected officials regarding procurement opportunities.
  - 2. Managing the policy and training buyers and other County personnel in order to meet County goals will be the responsibility of the HUB Office.
  - 3. The HUB Office will cooperate with other local government entities to increase HUB participation throughout the county and region. The HUB Office is encouraged to participate in educational and other outreach programs to assist HUB firms.
  - 4. The HUB Officer will receive and review complaints and recommendations regarding the implementation of the HUB Policy and the good faith efforts of bidders. Further, the HUB Office will audit for compliance to the HUB Policy on eligible projects after award, during the performance of the contract and after completion, while also making any recommendations to Commissioners Court regarding any irregularities or misrepresentation of facts as they relate to compliance with the policy. The HUB Office will review documentation submitted by HUB firms in compliance with this policy.
  - 5. An annual report along with recommendations shall be provided to the Commissioners Court and Purchasing Board. The annual report will provide statistical data and efforts reflected in the number of purchase orders, value of goods and services purchased, percentages to HUB firms, and outreach and marketing efforts. Other statistics may be required or requested by the Commissioners Court or Purchasing Board.




